LETTER FROM PASTOR

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, kings, and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. -1 Timothy 2:1-2

Thanksgiving evokes a lot of memories, traditions, and perhaps a rumbling stomach as well. We know we love our family gatherings around a table full of special dishes that we might only have once a year, and for the second time in two years, we get to gather around a football game between the teams from Detroit and Green Bay! I know I may be hoping that this one goes differently than the last one, but I may be alone on that!

We may have as part of our Thanksgiving tradition the routine of going around the table and saying something that you're thankful for. Maybe your family has the one person who is appointed to do the prayer. In all of the words of thanksgiving that we share together this month, there is a lot of repetition, and that is great! We all are thankful for family, friends, food, etc. But what I want to focus on from 1 Timothy 2 is that we are making prayers and intercessions, as well as thanksgivings for ALL.

It isn't always easy, but that is how the church is called to live. We seek to support ALL people by our words and deeds. Go back and read the explanations of the 10 Commandments from Luther's Small Catechism.

These explanations do not only speak of how we break the commandments, but also how we keep them. For example, we may break the 5th commandment by causing harm to other people, but we keep the 5th commandment by supporting those around us and doing good for them. Both are true, and both are necessary.

This can be very difficult given our own sinful condition, and the broken nature of the world around us. Conflict is lurking around every corner, and past words and actions linger in our memory banks. Once wonderful relationships have soured. The closest people to us have become distant. Once full hearts have been shattered. Can you give thanks for the people whom you have encountered these moments with? Are you able to reconcile with them and let the past be behind you even though they might not be willing to do the same? Are you able to pray for them, that God would bless them just as He has blessed you? This is incredibly difficult, but this is who our God is for us.

As we move into November, and as we approach Thanksgiving, let us remember Paul's words to Timothy. It is part of our vocation as a Christian, to support and pray for ALL people. That we are to give thanks to God for how He works through ALL people, and all things. That we are to treat ALL people with gentleness and respect, living according to God's Word, rejoicing in His Promise, and placing our hope in the resurrection.

Hello Zion Family,

I have to admit something. I am not a history buff. It was not my strong suit in school to remember historical names, dates, and facts. In fact, studying early Christian history at Concordia was a struggle, but I passed the class. So when it came time to sit down and write an article for the month of November, I of course thought about Thanksgiving. However, it was then that I realized I don't really know why we celebrate Thanksgiving. Why are we not giving thanks and gathering together more often than one day in late autumn?

My search led me to the encyclopedia Britannica (online) to find out what is the point of Thanksgiving? It appears to be a celebration that has roots in the 1600s with English colonists and the Wampanoag people having a feast of venison and wild fowl together. The main point was that they were actually getting along for a short period of time. While the truth of this was questionable according to Britannica, the idea of people coming together peaceably and bringing food for a feast has stuck. So we've continued the tradition ever since Abraham Lincoln declared it a national holiday. We come together at the table, family, friends, neighbors to break bread and eat our "wild game" and have a day of peaceable relations.

The colonists had a feast celebrating that they survived their journey to a new land. We have a feast each year celebrating our family coming together from far and wide that we haven't seen all too often. As Christians, we have an even greater Thanksgiving feast to look forward to. We see a little glimpse of this when we come together as a church at the rail on Sunday and find nourishment in Jesus' body and blood. We do this with thanksgiving looking forward to what is to come. Old Testament peoples celebrated the Feast of Tabernacles established in Leviticus 23 where they presented food and drink offerings to the Lord, they came together for seven days in their booths/tabernacles, and then rested on the eighth day. The final feast that is to come is shown in Revelation 19 at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb. We hear an angel in 19:9 proclaiming, "blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the lamb." This is us, the great multitude of believers, coming together in the presence of God for the greatest Thanksgiving feast there is. We will be together at the table proclaiming our Hallelujahs to the Lord.

As you come together at your Thanksgiving table this year, say your prayer for your meal, but also envision how great the feast will be at the end times. There, all those believers that have gone to sleep in the Lord will be with us around the table giving the ultimate thanks.

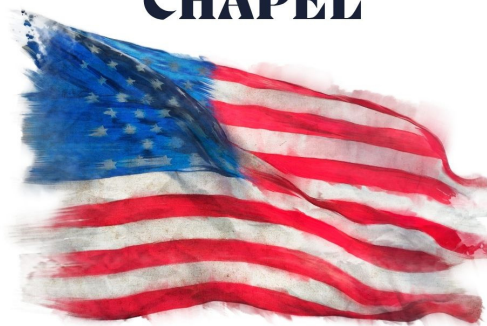
On Saturday, October 25th, Ellie placed 3rd in the National Meet!

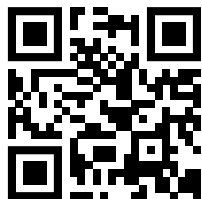

Beef Barley Soup

Serves 8

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs stew meat (cut into bite sized chunks)
- Salt & pepper
- 2 T oil
- 10 cups water
- 3 mounded Tablespoons of good quality beef base (Better than Bullion Beef Base)
- 3 stalks celery (about 2 cups), chopped
- 2 onions, chopped
- 5 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 large potato, peeled & shredded, about 2 cups
- 3-4 large carrots, peeled and shredded, about 2 cups
- 1 cup barley, rinsed

Instructions:

1. Generously salt & pepper beef. In large stockpot, heat the oil over medium-high heat.
2. When it is very hot, add about 1/3 of the meat. Brown for about 1-2 minutes, then turn to brown the other side. Remove to plate when it is browned on all sides.
3. Repeat with remaining two batches. (if you add it all at once it will steam the meat instead of browning it.)
4. When all the meat is browned, add all the meat back to the pot with 10 cups of water. Add the 3 healthy tablespoons of beef base.
5. Add chopped celery, onions and garlic. Bring to a boil, turn heat to medium-low and simmer for 2-3 hours with the lid on.
6. When the meat is tender and you can break it apart easily with a wooden spoon, add the shredded potato and carrots. Bring to a boil, then continue to simmer on low for another 30-45 minutes or until carrots are tender.
7. Add 1 cup of barley, bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low. Cook for another ½ hour or until barley is tender.

| ¼ c. butter | 1 teasp. vanilla |
| 1 c. sugar | 1 ¼ c. flour (sift) |
| 1 egg | 4 TBS. Cocoa (sift) |
| 1 c. milk | 1 teasp. Baking soda (sift) |

Cream softened butter & sugar. Add egg, milk, vanilla. Add sifted together flour, cocoa and baking soda. Bake in 19X13 pan, for thicker cake bake in smaller pan. Bake 375 degrees for 30 minutes. For cupcakes fill ½ full, any fuller does not rise well.

For yellow cake follow directions above except omit cocoa and add ¼ more cups flour and cinnamon for better flavor. I also add a little baking powder.

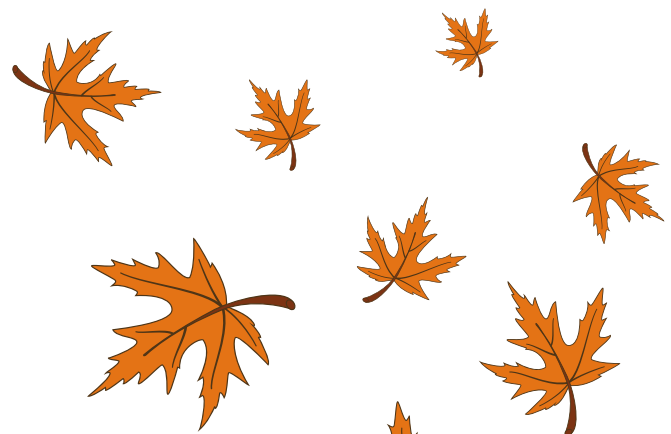
