LETTER FROM PASTOR

May we continue to raise and lead our households in this way.

It doesn't stop there. We also stand in unity in love for our neighbor, including those who oppose us, hate us, and even may be a danger to us. We stand in unity in our compassion for the people of this world who are lost, broken, and in need of a Savior. We stand in unity knowing that we too are broken, but out of His love for us, God sent His Son to save us. How could we not be motivated to share that with all people? We stand in unity of the truth in love and service.

It starts in your own household. Equip your children with the faith that God has given to you. Love your spouse in a way that Christ has loved you. And from there, we serve as missionaries in schools, at the workplace, and in our communities. May God continue to bless Zion Wayside, that together, we may continue to be united in faith, for the sake of our families and all of those around us.

Hello Zion Family,

11 But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt?" 12 He said, "But I will be with you, and this shall be the sign for you, that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain." Exodus 3:11-12

October brings a lot of exciting things for Zion with school fully in swing, halfway through our first session of education hour, our Open House at the end of the month, and Trunk-or-Treat. It is also church worker appreciation month -October 12th set aside for pastors & October 25th set aside for commissioned workers (deaconess, DCM, etc). When we think about church work, we can look all the way back to the Old Testament. In Exodus, we see Moses (who we now know to be a great leader) approach a bush that is on fire and receive instructions from God himself to lead the children of Israel out of Egypt. What was Moses' reaction? Who am I that I should do this?! He doesn't want to! He's not the only one in the Bible that has this reaction to God's calling. Remember someone named Jonah? How did that end for him? The people of Nineveh repented, but he had to get there the hard way. Surprisingly, maybe not surprisingly, this can be the reaction of those that God calls now, in the present day, to serve his church. Reactions might be the same as Moses. Who am I to lead God's people? However, God calls, he equips, and some of the most unlikely people lead.

In the history of Zion, God has set apart quite a large number of people to serve him as a called worker. Countless teachers, pastors, and other commissioned workers have come from this congregation.

Why is this? Zion as a congregation is firmly rooted in God's Word and sacrament. The church has not strayed from His teachings and from passing the Word down from generation to generation. Zion is living out its mission statement! Men and women see the effect that God's Word has in the lives of those around them, and they realize the call from God to continue to work in the church. His Word is powerful!

How can we keep being encouraging of younger generations to continue the trend and seek out church work fields? If you see someone who has the knack for exposition of the Word, maybe put the idea out there for them to preach or teach. Someone is talented in music, maybe they would be fit for a Director of Parish Music role or Music Education. There are numerous fields for serving the church that maybe you don't even know about. How do you find what way you might serve based on the gifts God has given you? The LCMS has an initiative called "Set Apart to Serve" which shares videos of those who have been called to serve, there are resources for talking to youth of all ages about church work, there's suggestions for those second career folks who may hear a call from God later in life, and there's talking points that one can use if they see someone who would be a great church leader. As we enter into October, I thank God for the wonderful called workers we have here at Zion who serve faithfully and with purpose. Continue to keep our called workers in your prayers, we need it! Serving God can be both rewarding and challenging! And if you're considering church work, we'd love to talk to you!

Greetings in our Lord and Savior!



INSTANT HOT CHOCOLATE

Barh Zahel

2 (8-qt.) pkg. powdered milk 1 (2-lb.) pkg. Quik chocolate 1 (12-oz.) jar powdered cream 2 c. powdered sugar

Combine all ingredients together. Store at room temperature in an air tight

container. Add ¼ cup mix to 1 cup hot water.

Spicy Sausage Soup

MAKES: 8-10 SERVINGS FREP. TIME: 25 MINUTES COOKING TIME: 6-8 HOURS CEAL SLOW COOKER SIZE: 5-6 QUART

1 lb. ground beef

1 lb. bulk spicy sausage (casings removed)

half a large onion, chopped

2 cups chopped carrots

2 cups chopped celery

1 green or red bell pepper, chopped, optional

2 tsp. salt, or to taste

tsp. pepper, or to taste

1 tsp. dried oregano, or to taste

2 or 3 garlic cloves, minced

14½-oz. can stewed tomatoes with chilles


141/2-oz. can green beans

tsp. chili powder

1 cup instant rice, uncooked

- 1. Combine beef, sausage, and onions. Form into balls. Place in slow cooker.
- 2. Add all remaining ingredients, except rice. Stir gently so as not to break up the meatballs.
- 3. Cover. Cook on Low 6-8 hours. Stir in rice 20 minutes before serving.
- Serve with rolls or cornbread.

Put your cooker meal together the right before you want to cook it. The following morning put the mixture in the slow cooker, cover, and turn it on.

Tiny premature twin babies who were born at only 20 weeks gestation have defied the odds thanks to a life-saving twin cot. Marcus and Macie Lee, from Glasgow, were born prematurely after their mother, Jennifer Prior, developed complications during her pregnancy at 20 weeks gestation. Hospital staff warned that the children were likely to be stillborn. However, fortunately, this was not the case, and the tiny babies were born weighing only 11b 3oz and 21b. Even though they had made it safely out of the womb, they had to spend the first ten weeks of their lives in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of Glasgow Children's Hospital. Thankfully, after receiving round-the-clock care from medical staff, Marcus and Macie were able to leave the hospital after three months. "As time went on they thrived more and more with very little complication," Jennifer said. "Being told the worst was likely to happen .. then for the complete opposite, felt like a miracle. I'll never forget the feeling of thinking I wouldn't leave without my babies. I was there day and night ... hoping someone would give me some hope and confirmation they would survive." The newborn twins were the first to use the hospital's new co-sleeping cot, which medics believe "made a massive difference to their progress." 
