## LETTER FROM PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

With the dog days of summer behind us and fall on the horizon, the changing weather is not the only new thing that we are experiencing. There is new all around us. Children and grandchildren are beginning a new school year. New sports seasons are in full swing. Maybe you are getting excited for a new season of Packer football. Even here at Zion Wayside we are experiencing a lot of new. Our students and teachers are eagerly awaiting the completion of our new classrooms. At the same time, in church we are gearing up for new service times along with a new Sunday morning education hour.

While all of this new is certainly exciting, it may also seem overwhelming. All of the new will take some getting used to. Things may not go exactly as we hope and the transition may not be perfectly smooth, but despite all of this we have one constant. One solid rock, one firm foundation which keeps us grounded. In the midst of whatever new, whatever change we may be experiencing in our church, school, work, or home; we have the solid, steady, firm foundation of our savior Jesus Christ. "He is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8)

It is our firm foundation, Jesus Christ that makes all the new things going on around us truly exciting. In the coming months we will have three new classrooms where the good news about Jesus will be shared with our students. On Sunday mornings we will have an education hour where members of every age will have the opportunity to gather together and dive into God's Word. This will be a time in addition to worship for our community here at Zion Wayside to deepen our faith, grow in our understanding of Jesus, and join in fellowship with one another. What a blessing!

That is the big picture. Here is a closer look at what Sunday mornings will look like beginning on September 7. Sunday morning worship will be at 7:45 and 10 am (6:30pm on Wednesday nights). Other than late service starting 30 minutes later, worship will continue exactly as you are used to with traditional service at 7:45 am and contemporary worship at 10 am. The exciting new piece on Sunday morning is our education hour which will take place from 9-9:50 am.

Sunday school (3 years old - 4th grade) will be looking at a different Gospel story each week based on the Gospel reading that we have in church. Along with this, they will be singing songs, having snacks, and making arts and crafts each week. 5/6th grade confirmation will be going through a general bible overview this year while 7/8th grade will be working through the biblical narrative focusing on how our faith impacts our daily lives. ZYP (our high school youth) led by Deaconess Intern Lisa Kalscheur will be largely student driven with the youth choosing topics based on their own experiences and interests. Adult bible study will be a year-round, pastor led bible study. We will kick this new adult Bible Study off with Pastor Kyle leading a study on The Rhythm of Creation. This first topic will be all about the Christian life and how God has designed us to live.

Our church staff looks forward to learning, growing, serving, and living together with you as we equip every generation for life in Christ!

September will be an exciting time of changes at Zion! Service time changes, kick-off of education hour, youth events, and small group Bible study training. Our church staff is looking forward to more opportunities to spend time in the Word with our church families! Our first few weeks of changes will be a challenge for sure. We're all in this together and these hurdles will be overcome and it will all be a good change! One of the learning opportunities I am looking forward to is the new small group Bible Study. We are holding a small group leader training session on **September 17 at 7:30pm** and I wanted to share why the meeting and what the study is about. The Bible Study that we've chosen is from Lutheran Hour Ministries and is called Households of Faith. Households of Faith is research based and provides insights about the nature of Christian households in society today and the important role households play in Christian faith formation. The study will help members of all walks of life apply spiritual disciplines, extend hospitality, and engage in spiritual conversations in their household. It will help grow the vibrancy of your home!!



Because of all the research that is behind the book that will be studied, *The Spiritually Vibrant Home*, we would like leaders/facilitators to be equipped with more information for their groups, a special book to read, and a schedule of how the study comes together. We want to equip you to equip other families!

Throughout the 5 week study, groups will discover why households matter, learn about Christian households today, learn what spiritually vibrant households look like, learn about spiritual coaching, and then finally do self evaluating and goal setting. There are videos, handouts and books to help you along through all of this, but more importantly is the group itself and talking to other households as you go through the study. We at Zion do a wonderful job of supporting each other, learning from each other, and spending time in fellowship. As we start looking at forming small groups, start thinking about who you would like to host at your home and have conversations with about growing your spiritual vibrancy. Maybe you know of church members in your neighborhood and would like to have them for coffee and cookies and work through this new study together. Maybe you have no idea who lives around you and need the church staff to help you find this out, we can!! Either way, we are looking forward to seeing relationships formed, the Word studied, and information learned that helps us all grow when small groups start September 28th. Please prayerfully consider hosting a small group, I hope to see you at the leadership meeting September 17th!

- 1/2 # bacon - fry, drain, crumble

On July 25, the Associated Press and the NORC Center for Public Affairs Research released the results of a poll of over 1,400 adults in mid-July. The findings contain good news for pro-lifers. The results indicate that the percentage of adults who think abortion should be illegal in "all cases" or "most cases" has increased by seven percentage points since June 2024. Overall, this AP/NORC poll reports the highest level of pro-life sentiment since the leak of the Dobbs decision in May 2022. The survey asked respondents about whether "your state should allow someone to obtain a legal abortion" in each of four different circumstances. For each circumstance, support for legal abortion fell during the past year. Notably, the percentage of people who supported legal abortion if the woman "does not want to be pregnant for any reason" fell by five percentage points. Considering the media's consistently negative coverage of pro-life laws, this gain in pro-life sentiment is welcome news. This is the second major poll this summer to show an increase in pro-life sentiment. In June, Gallup released the results of its annual poll on sanctity-of-life issues. Gallup found gains in the percentage of people who identified as "pro-life" and the percentage of people who felt that abortion was "morally wrong."
