2.	<p>Treasurer Report Transactions since last Committee / Working Group meeting on 13.05.24</p> <p>Opening Current Account Balance (11.05.24): £8,442.73</p> <p>Income received: All current account income relates to advertiser payments for the summer edition of the PL24 magazine - there are still outstanding invoices amounting to £610. We continue to receive interest on the savings account amounting to £3.44 this month.</p> <p>Payments made: In this period, we paid for the printing of the PL24 Magazine June/Summer edition and for the annual premium for our liability insurance.</p> <p>Closing Current Account Balance (17.06.24): £7,105.73</p> <p>Notes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Our financial year end is 31st August each year. The annual accounts for 2022/23 have been produced and verified by the independent informal auditor prior to the AGM in October. <p>We are holding £3,021.54 reserve in an immediate access savings account attracting 1.3% interest payable monthly.</p>
