Plot Description (100-150 words):

After a lifetime of surgeries for hip dysplasia and lessons from her Peruvian parents on how to be a 'good immigrant' in the face of fears of deportation, Veronica defies the wishes of her parents and applies for a summer job as a mermaid at a local theme park in their small Florida town. With a blossoming romance with the new boy in their apartment complex, and new information about the seriousness of her condition, the secrets between Veronica and her parents mount. Veronica's efforts to assert her bodily autonomy in a loving but strict home forces Veronica and her family to find courage to be honest with themselves and each other. Sylvester writes a protagonist both brave and flawed and surrounds her with a diverse cast of supporting characters, who, as she grows in finding her own voice, Veronica learns all have their own obstacles to living authentically.

Qualitative Reading Analysis:

Sylvester's writing is accessible for high school readers while employing complexity of character and rich figurative language. The moderate complexity of sentence structure creates smooth reading, though specific medical terminology will challenge students to deepen their reading skills and vocabulary. While the day-today experiences of these teens should feel familiar, the glimpse into a Peruvian-American family's experience as immigrants, Veronica's experience with hip dis hip dysplasia, and life in a Florida suburb will allow many readers to broaden their world view and experiences.
