Author Presentations & Creative Writing Workshops

One of my greatest joys is connecting with students and readers through story—and in turn, empowering them to tell their own. From general assemblies to smaller groups like English and Creative Writing classes and book clubs, my presentations aim to demystify the writing process in hopes of making storytelling more accessible.

I share my own personal path to book publishing as someone who moved to the US at a young age, learned English as a second language, and navigated health issues and multiple surgeries. Through slides, photos, and interactive prompts, my presentations show the behind-the-scenes realities of being an author while openly and honestly discussing topics like self-acceptance, overcoming obstacles, and finding our voices.

My presentations can be adapted for audiences of different grades and sizes. Below is just a small sampling of topics. I'm also happy to tailor a talk for your school's specific theme or needs.

What's in Your Maleta?

For: Grades K - 2 | Preparation: A Maleta Full of Treasures

Curricular Connections: Social Studies or General Assembly

Part storytime, part journey through the treasures of the Andes. In this fun and engaging presentation, Natalia shares the story of Dulce, a Peruvian American immigrant who anticipates visits from family members, giddily wondering what they'll bring in their maletas, or suitcases. Peruvian sights, flavors, and textures, as well as mini Spanish lessons and geographical tidbits, prompt students to look to their own communities and loved ones to ask: what treasures would you pack in *your* maleta?

The Journey of a Book

For: Grades 3 - 6 | Preparation: A Maleta Full of Treasures

Curricular Connections: Language Arts or General Assembly

Journey through the making of *A Maleta Full of Treasures*, from its messy, handwritten first draft and early sketches by the artist to a finished book students can hold in their hands. This interactive presentation gives students a behind-the-scenes look at the processes of brainstorming, researching, drafting, and revising, encouraging them to apply these skills not only to writing, but to design processes all around them.

You Don't Have to Change the World to Change the World

For: Grades 7 - 12 | Preparation: Running

Curricular Connections: Social Studies, Language Arts or General Assembly

Making a difference in the world and writing a novel are a lot alike: they can both feel incredibly daunting and overwhelming. Natalia Sylvester shares behind-the-scenes looks at the obstacles she faced while writing *Running*—from handwritten first drafts to completion—to create parallels between the process of imagining a new world on the page and reimagining a better world in real life.

Writing prompts and interactive exercises lead students through small steps that add up to meaningful change. This presentation can be tailored for general assemblies or a smaller group with writing exercises.

Mermaids Made Me Do It

For: Grades 9 - 12 | Preparation: Breathe and Count Back from Ten

Curricular Connections: Language Arts, Social Studies and General Assembly

From growing up in and out of surgeries to dreaming of being a mermaid, Natalia shares the real-life experiences that inspired *Breathe and Count Back from Ten*—as well as the doubts and insecurities that almost kept her from writing the book in the first place. Students get behind-the-scenes looks at her writing notebooks, messy first drafts, revision choices, research, and more. Together we dive into topics like writer's block, the importance of telling our stories, and how to fully embrace all the parts of us that make us whole.

Bodies Of Water

For: Grades 9 - 12 | Preparation: Breathe and Count Back from Ten

Curricular Connections: Language Arts or General Assembly

It can be difficult to write about our bodies, but the safety of the water and its mythical sea creatures can provide a beautiful outlet. In this presentation, Natalia Sylvester shares her personal experiences as a disabled Latina immigrant who experienced bullying, and how writing *Breathe and Count Back from Ten* was a form of expression and healing. She then guides students through writing exercises that empower them to write their own stories. **This presentation can be tailored for general assemblies or a smaller group with writing exercises**.
