Creative Photocropping, 2001 Satellite Press. *Whimsical* ideas like cutting out all your siblings and putting them in and around a collage house, giving a special family member wings, taking photos of favorite family snacks, cutting photos into letters/numbers, swapping out faces and bodies. This book has a convenient **summary** of techniques and ideas at the end.

Image Art Workshop by Paula Guhin, 2009, Creative Publishing International. **FULL** of ideas with clear visuals, steps, and pointers from the author.

Mixed Emulsions by Angela Cartwright, 2007, Quarry Books. An extensive look at many **art mediums** that can be used with photos, examples from a variety of contributors.

Playing with Image Transfers by Courtney Cerruti, 2013, Quarry Books. Chapter 1 gives a summary of **image transfer techniques** with step-by-step photos, but then the book gets more into crafts.

The Complete Guide to Altered Imagery by Karen Michel, 2005, Quarry Books. When book is tilted "complete" I have my doubts, but this book does have lots of visuals to stimulate your ideas.

True Vision by L.K. Ludwig, 2008 Quarry Books. Some of my take-aways from this book: family photos in a layer cake, stenciled portrait from an app, sanding photos, a photo quilt with "scraps" of info, using photos of the house where you or family members grew up, coloring in backgrounds of photos, using silhouettes, maps of favorite places, using large handwriting as background.
