OUR AIM

At Jamia Masjid Ibrahim, our primary objective is to offer the finest Islamic education to the children of the Ummah.

Our overarching goal is to actively contribute to the nurturing of these children, fostering their development into exemplary Muslims. We firmly believe that an Islamic environment is indispensable for cultivating the essential Islamic values in their lives.

Our vision is to enlighten our students, equipping them to serve as inspirational role models for their fellow Muslim youth within the Ummah. We are dedicated to upholding the principle that our dedicated Ustadhs (teachers) assume the role of carers and guide students during their lesson times. It is the responsibility of Ustadhs to ensure that each child is disciplined in the most effective manner, a critical element in the proper upbringing of our students.

Our ultimate aim is for every student to graduate from our Madrassah imbued with the highest standards of Akhlaq (character), embedded with taqwa (awareness of Allah) and a deep-seated love and pride for their Deen (faith).

WHAT WE WILL TEACH?

Our approach is, teachings according to the individual abilities of our students. For those who are just beginning their journey to read the Qur'an, we provide a strong foundation by starting with the Qaidah. Meanwhile, students with more advanced skills commence their learning directly from the Qur'an itself.

Our commitment extends to imparting a comprehensive understanding of the Qur'an, encompassing all the intricate tajweed rules. In addition to Qur'anic studies, we also instill Islamic knowledge and values through carefully selected books and enlightening lectures.

All students will start islamic studies books from the beginning.



01 — Qaidah/ Qur'aan & Hifz

Student will be taught to read the Qur'aan with fluency and tajweed. Students who meet eligibility criteria will be enrolled onto our Hifz Programme, wherein the student will be taught memorisation of the Quran with complete Tajweed and Ijazah.



02 — Islamic Studies

Students will be taught islamic teachings and islamic jurisprudence(according to their level of understanding and age). The Aim of this section of studies for our students is to equip them with the knowledge they need to live their lives as righteous Muslims and contributors to society.



03 — Imaniyat/Tazkiyah/Akhlaq/ Dawah

Students Willly be taught islamic values and then also practically shown how to live their lives as Muslims of the utmost obedience to Allah. We don't only aim to do these through lessons and lectures, but through providing real opportunities for students to engage in Dawah, Tazkiyah and ultimately build on their Iman. We believe that Madrassah should be a medium for spiritual growth, not just the learning of knowledge

ISLAMIC STUDIES BOOKS WE WILL USE

We are dedicated to utilizing the following books in our curriculum, firmly convinced that they represent the most comprehensive and beneficial resources available for Islamic studies among students. .



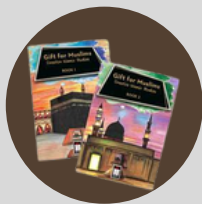
01 — A Child's Gift

A Beginner students Book- teaches the student simple Dua's, hadith and ilm. This book aims to guide young muslim childrens life on the basis of Sunnah and Qur'an. It is an excellent introductory book for our students.



02 — Safar Academy

An Intermediate students book- this book goes a step further, it is more detailed and delves into important topics of Deen. These books are a set of textbooks and workbooks for students to apply their knowledge.



03 — A Gift for Muslim

An advanced students book- These book will be used for the Students only after completing the Safar Academy books. These books are very detailed and teaches the student Dua's, Hadith, and ilm with more detail.

WHAT WE EXPECT FROM PARENTS?

The significance of this parental involvement is underscored by the words of the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him): "The parents of whoever reads the Qur'an and acts upon what is in it will be crowned on the day of Judgment, the light of which will be greater than the light of the sun if it were to be contained in a worldly house, therefore, what do you think the reward of the person would be who (actually) acts upon it?" (Abu Dawud, Witr, 14). This Hadith explains the immense reward awaiting those who actively participate in their child's Quranic education, underscoring the importance of parental engagement in fostering a strong Islamic foundation.



01 — Commitment

Our desire is for parents to wholeheartedly dedicate themselves to the upbringing of their children, instilling them with profound Islamic values and teachings. This commitment should extend to their child's Quranic education, with parents actively engaged in ensuring their child's successful learning journey through the Qur'an. We expect homes of our students to have the environment of deen within them.
