

Albertina's Dream of Becoming a Nurse

At just 18 years old, Albertina, who lives in Sucre, dreamed of becoming a nurse. To support her studies and to help her parents with home expenses, she worked nights in a kitchen, earning \$129 a month. But one day, while shopping with her mother, tragedy struck. She tripped while crossing the street, and a passing bus ran over her arm.

Her soft-tissue injuries were so painful, that she could no longer attend school or work. She also had costly hospital bills from her emergency room visit. Her wounds became infected, and she had no money for continuing care. She thought that she had nowhere to turn – until her aunt brought her to the Mission of Hope clinic.

At the clinic, Albertina's wounds were cleaned, and she received continuing care. Today, she is painfree, has full mobility, and is ready to resume her nursing studies and to work again. Albertina expressed her deep gratitude, saying, "I did not know that free medical care like this existed. Thanks be to God for the care of Mission of Hope!"

Angélica Finds Compassion and Healing

Angélica, a 46-year-old woman from Sucre, lives with her three grown children. She helped with the household expenses by washing other people's clothes for \$3 per dozen garments, but even simple daily tasks had become painful. Shoulder aches, headaches, and abdominal pain had grown so intense that she could no longer manage housework or dress herself without difficulty. She was no longer able to wash clothes and could not afford the diagnostic tests she needed. She didn't know where to turn.

But when Angélica came to the Mission of Hope clinic, she found both medical help and compassion. The needed tests were done and revealed a gallbladder polyp. Thankfully, no surgery is needed for now, but she will continue receiving free, regular check-ups and guidance on how to care for her health.

Angélica gave her heartfelt thanks for what she had received and said, "Each time I have come here, I've received prompt care and medicine that has brought me relief. I thank God for Mission of Hope – for the doctors, the pastor, and the staff who encourage us when we are most in need."



A Message from a Grateful Mother

My name is Liria, and I am the mother of Mosiah, who is seven years old. Since the age of two, he suffered from constant colds. His tonsils were always swollen, and at night he often ran a fever. We took him to the health center many times, but the treatments gave little relief. He would improve for a while, only to become sick again with swollen tonsils.

At one point he became very ill. He had dengue, anemia, and even nearly suffered convulsions. My husband and I took him to a recommended pharmacy where, thankfully, he was stabilized, though it required a great expense. After visiting several doctors and spending money in vain and without real improvement, a neighbor told me about the Mission of Hope clinic.

Without hesitation, and with strong faith that my little one could be helped, I went to the clinic before the sun came up. My son was the first patient to see the pediatrician that day. The doctor who attended us was excellent. After two visits, he explained that surgery would be the best option and began the process to prepare for it. After much prayer and discussion with my husband, we felt confident that surgery was the right decision for Mosiah. My husband even fasted for 24 hours, praying to God and to Jesus Christ that everything would go well.

when the day of surgery arrived, we were naturally nervous, but at the same time our faith in God remained strong. Our whole family was praying for him. Thanks to our blessed Creator, everything went well. Today I am filled with joy and gratitude – to God for His miracles, and to the doctors, nurses, helpers, and all the staff who gave such wonderful care without regard to our religion or where we came from.

I am glad to see my son happy. I thank God, and I thank all of you.

May the Lord always bless you and return to you far more than what you

so generously give.
