Thank you for your interest in the 2026 Carpenter's Hands Ministry summer mission trip. In this letter I hope to share our vision for what God has called us to do in Bennington Vermont.

First, a little background. We took our first trip to Bennington to work on "The Old Stone Church" in 2005. This church was built in the 1700's. It had been abandoned for 15 years and was condemned by the county government because parts of the steeple were falling into the streets below. The church was given to the Green Mountain Baptist Association on condition they bring it up to current building codes. A project if contracted would take several million dollars. This is where NC Baptist Men came in. Carpenter's Hands was the first of many teams to work on this church over the next 3 summers. It did not take millions of dollars, but a lot of prayer, sweat and hard work. Though the building was repaired, the state of Vermont was stone cold dead spiritually. Less than 2% of the population are professing Christians, and they did not want to hear about Jesus and His Good News. Baptist Men & Women did not give up. Summer after summer NC Baptists went to Vermont to demonstrate the love of Jesus. God blessed! Now Phil Stedman, pastor at Capstone Baptist Church, (old stone church)-said things are changing. People are open to the sharing of the Gospel, attitudes towards Christians have radically changed, and people are being saved. A recent report showed, percentage wise, more people in Vermont are being saved than any state in the nation! God is Good!

This summer will be our 9th trip to Vermont. We plan to work on Grace Christian School and Northeastern Baptist College.

We begin this new year with thanksgiving, with joy, and with prayerful expectation. First, we are thankful for our Amazing God, for all He has done in and through NEBC! We are also thanking the Lord for you and all you have done to help NEBC impact the Northeast, the nation and the world.

Second, we begin 2026 with the joy of the Lord! As the Apostle Paul indicates in 1 Thess. 5:16 we always have a reason to choose joy. We not only have the absolute assurance of a real and vibrant relationship with Jesus today, but for all of eternity. We also experience great joy as we join Him in His work.

Third, we begin with prayerful expectation. The Lord has accomplished so much leading up to this amazing moment, but I believe we are right on the cusp of an even greater work of God in the coming days, weeks, months, and throughout 2026. Allison Student Housing Village this year. In fact, it must be complete by October 15, 2026. We also need mission teams to help us open the graduate library as soon as possible. Once the library is open, we can prepare the new chapel building for the fall semester. We will need the chapel operational prior to the start of the fall 2026 semester (late August). All three of these construction projects are crucial for us to keep up with the rapid growth the Lord is bringing.

When we opened the doors to NEBC in August of 2013, there were fourteen churches in our Baptist network, here in Vermont. Today, we have 60 churches across the Green Mountain State. As mission teams help us prepare housing space, library space, chapel space, etc., the Lord fills the space immediately. As these new students begin gaining the mind of a scholar in the classroom, they also begin serving in the Northeast harvest fields by sharing the Gospel, discipling new believers, and serving in churches and church plants across the region. As our students graduate, they start churches, pastor churches, and get the Gospel to one town after another through the various fields of study the Lord has led them.

When I think of all the Lord has done the first thirteen years of NEBC, I am filled with joy and thanksgiving. When I think about the number of students we have today, the number of students the Father is bringing to us this month, and the number of students already signed up for the fall semester, I am confident that within the second decade, or possibly sooner, we can actually see a Gospel witness in every town across this state. Yet, we cannot do it without you. We need your continued prayers. We need you to continue to come on mission trips. We need you to continue to give, as the Lord leads. We need you to invite others to come on mission and get involved.

Mentoring Program for All Degree Students

Shepherd Groups

Every student will be a part of a small group of no more than 12 students. A member of the faculty will serve as the Shepherd of the group, providing guidance in academic advisement, personal spiritual growth, ministry experience, and personal development. Every Wednesday the Shepherd Groups will meet during the Chapel hour and then have lunch with their Shepherd. Each Shepherd Group will have the opportunity to have lunch with the President on a rotating basis.

Church Ministry

Every student will be involved in some aspect of ministry throughout their degree program. The specific involvement required will be based on the student's major. Extensive partnerships with local churches and associations will afford hands-on experience in church planting, pastoral ministries, education, music and writing.

Evangelistic Encounters / Friday Blitz

Every student will be required to make at least one attempt to share the Gospel each week. They will turn in a brief report of who they shared with, what was said, and the results to their Shepherd.

Students will have the opportunity to participate in a Friday Blitz. Under the leadership of faculty members the students will participate in some form of servant evangelism in the local community. Every student will be required to participate in at least 2 Friday Blitz events each academic year. If their schedule does not permit participation, an alternative will be arranged with the student's Shepherd.

Grace Christian School

Grace Christian School is a non-denominational school that is centered on Biblical principles located in Bennington, VT. Founded in 1997, GCS began with 35 students, grades K-5 in a church basement. Currently located in a former Ramada Inn, GCS enrolls approximately 165 students pre-school through 12th grade. Students have Bible as one of their core subjects and attend chapel once a week.

An exciting aspect of our school community has been the increase of international students. We have enjoyed having students from Moldova, Germany, Ukraine, Russia, S. Korea and Hong Kong. These students are not allowed to practice Christianity in their homeland, but specifically requested to come to a Christian school and to be placed in a host family where they can attend church. Using a "reverse missionary" mindset we can bring those seeking Christ in to a school where praise music plays in the halls and students and teachers alike openly share their faith.




Our teachers and staff earn about 1/3 of what they would make in a public school setting. Their responsibilities are at least twice as great. 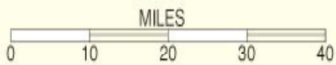

Cost of Trip

There is a \$100.00 first week charge for meals and lodging. This includes Sunday breakfast through Saturday breakfast (19 meals) and snacks. If you stay 2 or 3 weeks, each additional week is \$100.00 per week.

Mission trip insurance and t-shirts are \$15.00. There is a suggested, optional \$185.00 donation for materials that will be given to the scheduled projects for Bennington, Vermont. Additional donations to help cover other materials are appreciated. Young people under 18 do not have to pay the \$185.00 donation for materials.

The Travel Accident Insurance coverage is provided by Baptists on Mission. This is a supplemental plan designed to help if needed with deductibles or co-pays not covered by your personal insurance plan.

Each person is responsible for their own airline ticket or you can drive up. We can pick you up at the Albany, NY airport (ALB) each Saturday, as long as you arrive by 6:00pm. We can return you to the airport as long as the flight is not an early morning flight. You can also rent a car in Albany. This would give you the most freedom getting around as well as in picking flight times.

Please make all checks payable to Carpenter's Hands Ministry. Payments may be submitted at mission trip meetings or given directly to Rhonda Summerville. What is Required of You?

1. Daily Bible Study

- Agree to start if not already involved

2. Daily Prayer

- Pray for other members of the team
- Pray for other groups participating in the project
- Pray for Grace Christian School K-12-Bennington Northeastern Bible College-Bennington
- Pray for the mission trip itself

3. Learn to share the Gospel and to share your testimony.

4. Attend meetings about this mission trip.

5. Help with the fund-raising projects for the mission trip.

- Yard Sale: Donate items, collect items and/or participate in the event itself.
- The yard sale will pay for equipment and material cost for the camp and VBS. The yard sale will also cover fuel for the truck and tool trailer to and from Vermont, some materials for jobs, and other miscellaneous cost.

Preparing and Sharing Your Testimony

The purpose of any mission trip is to share the good news about Jesus Christ. Even if you are going on this trip to do something other than evangelism, you should go prepared to share your testimony. Spend some time in prayer before you go and pray that God will give you an opportunity to share Christ. Begin praying for people you will have opportunity to share with.

God may be preparing a situation with a store clerk, someone on the construction site, a child in VBS, a young person at a camp, etc. where He will use you to plant a seed of the gospel or lead that person to Christ. You can be prepared for this opportunity by knowing how to share Christ through your testimony. Perhaps this outline can help:

1. **How I realized I needed Christ** (20% of your testimony) Look back on your life. What was your life like before you met Christ? This should be a short part of your testimony that emphasizes how your sinful condition kept you apart from a relationship with Christ.
2. **How I became a Christian** (20% of your testimony) Briefly share the circumstances of how you came to realize you needed Christ to save you from your sins. What did you do? How could someone else make this same decision? Be prepared to share the basics of how a person can accept Christ?
3. **How Christ leads me in my life today** (60% of your testimony) How has your life changed? What difference has Christ made in your actions, decisions, lifestyle, etc.?
Discuss looking forward to eternity and your hope of heaven because of your relationship with Christ?

Write your testimony out. This will help you focus on important points that you want to remember. You should be able to give your testimony in 2-3 minutes. People will usually give you a short amount of time to share your experience with Christ. You should be prepared to answer and ask questions if you have opportunity to continue the dialogue about salvation. You should give the individual a chance to respond to your testimony.

Remember, your responsibility is to plant seeds and share truth. Trust the Holy Spirit to direct your conversation and to convict the individual of his/her need for Christ.

You should try to know the following scripture passages from memory:

John 3:16

Romans 3:23-25

Romans 6:23

Romans 10:9-10

Romans 8:38-39

Here are some helpful hints in sharing your testimony:

Be positive - Point to the greatness of God's grace against the sinful condition from which He saved you
Listen

Encourage feedback

Don't argue - If you can argue someone into a decision, someone else can argue them out

Offer to pray for the person

Try not to be offensive

Try not to be defensive

IRS Deductions for Volunteer Mission Projects:

In consultation with the auditors and the Business Management, the following information may be helpful to you in obtaining an IRS charitable contribution deduction relating to your expenses for volunteer mission project.

Generally, you can claim a charitable contribution deduction for travel expenses necessarily incurred while you are away from your home performing services for a charitable organization only if there is no significant element of personal pleasure, recreation, or vacation in the travel. This applies whether you pay the expenses directly or indirectly. You are paying the expenses indirectly if you make a payment to the charitable organization pays you for your travel expenses.

The deduction for travel expenses will not be denied simply because you enjoy providing services to the charitable organization. Even if you enjoy the trip, you can take a charitable contribution deduction for your travel expenses if you are on duty in a genuine and substantial sense throughout the trip. However, if you have only nominal duties, or if for significant parts of the trip you do not have any duties, you cannot deduct your travel expenses.

Deductible travel expenses include air, rail, and bus transportation; out of pocket expenses for your car; taxi fare or other costs of transportation between the airport or station and your hotel; lodging costs; and the cost of meals.

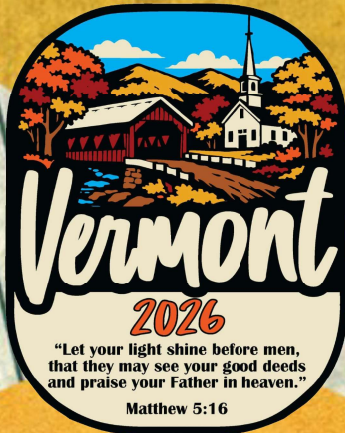
When/Where: Saturday, **May 2nd** at 8:00 AM—Beth Nelson Mission Impact Center

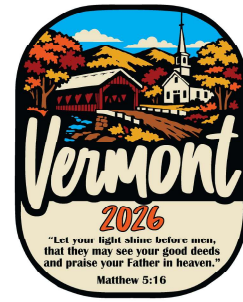
