### January 2025 Lecturer's Reflection

#### Brother Knights,

Happy New Year! Technology is a wonderful thing that can make our lives easier. At the drop of a hat, we can have vast amounts of information on virtually any topic. We can use it to communicate with one another in a much more timely and efficient means than other eras of history and technology can also be used as an effective means to both evangelize those new to Catholicism and strengthen the faith of practicing Catholics through such organizations as Word on Fire and Ascension. Technology is something that has made our lives easier. However, like many things there is a negative side to it as well.

Many times, while taking my dad out for a walk at Smith Point, I have seen people glued to their phone not taking in the spectacular vista of ocean. To me this is sad. At work during middle school advisory, I overhear conversations regarding the latest developments of their social media accounts. As a teacher I have observed the effect of overuse of social media on young people which is often stress, lack of motivation, inability to focus, and high levels of anxiety. This is disordered in my opinion, and it should not be this way. Sadly, our society is obsessed with technology and social media which if society is not careful, will wreak havoc. We are already beginning to see the changes in people disordered use of technology can have. Now I would like to read an excerpt from a January 1<sup>st</sup> Word on Fire article written by Alejandro Teran-Somohano called "The Vice of a Technocratic Age"

"St. Thomas Aguinas, writing eight centuries ago, very accurately described life in the age of social media." Aguinas did not know what our machines would be capable of, nor their impact on our lives, and as far as we can tell, he did not even imagine anything like them could exist, but in describing the vice of acedia (or sloth), he managed to capture modern life with uncanny accuracy. Acedia is a "sorrow for spiritual good," a sorrow that comes from either not thinking of spiritual goods as good and thus sorrowing because they are perceived as evil, or from being discouraged by the difficulty of attaining them and refusing to do the work needed to acquire them....Our minds are forever wandering, jumping from distraction to distraction, scrolling endlessly through online content. Even our work is constantly interrupted by a never-ending stream of notifications, emails, phone calls, instant messages. Have we not all experienced "uneasiness of mind," a lack of focus from switching from one screen to another, jumping from phone to computer to television to smart watch, from clicking on an infinite chain of hyperlinks? All this technology serves a variety of purposes which only distract us from the one and only purpose that matters. Like Martha, we are so anxious and burdened with the many things our devices are constantly nagging us about that we neglect the one thing that is needed. We are thus robbed of the better part, which leads us promptly to despair. We might not recognize these daughters by the terms Aquinas used to name them, but today we would refer to them as anxiety and depression."

Brothers, while this may not be as applicable to those of us here, I am sure we all know someone who is obsessed with technology to the point he or she is always glued to some device. It is important that we recognize these situations when they present themselves. The wonderful thing is as Knights of Columbus we arrange and take part in many social events and at times pray and attend Mass together. Thus, serving as an example in our community. Real person to person interactions is the antidote to the overuse of technology. The powers that be are pushing constant obsessive use of social media particularly on younger people to advance their worldly agenda which is not in harmony with the gospel message. Through prayer we can meet these societal challenges head on and advocate for moderation and discernment with how we interact with and utilize the various modes of technology available to us as a society. By doing so we can set an

example for generations to come that what truly matters can never be found by scrolling through some feed but rather the boundless love that are Lord and Savior has for each one of us.
