Piloting our methodology with seniors and youth across the EU

During the last few months, we have been finalizing the implementation of the second workshop with the seniors and youth while starting the piloting sessions aimed at promoting the exchange of knowledge between generations. These sessions focus on developing digital and green skills through mentorship and hands-on activities, such as navigating on social platforms, sharing recipes and learning how to craft.

- **Spain:** Older adults explored mobile apps for daily life activities and learned about ChatGPT, while young people created traditional "giants" from recycled material.
- **Austria:** Youth helped seniors with smartphone skills, preparing for AI and photography workshops to enhance intergenerational learning.
- **Cyprus:** Youth mentored seniors in digital skills while seniors shared sustainable traditions, fostering mutual empowerment.
- **Romania:** Seniors explored the digital tools as youth got insights into traditional recipes and crafts.


