**EUROPEAN BATTLES**

The defeat of the Axis powers at this battle led to their withdrawal from the Caucasus, marking a major turning point in the Second World War. <u>A: STALINGRAD</u>	6 Q: This 1428-1429 battle was the first major French victory of the Hundred Years' War after their defeat at Agincourt in 1415. The English siege of the city for which this battle is named collapsed nine days after the arrival of Joan of Arc. <u>A: ORLÉANS</u>
7 Q: This 1314 battle led to the de facto establishment of Scottish independence, after Robert the Bruce defeated Edward II of England. <u>A: BANNOCKBURN</u>	8 Q: This 1444 battle saw an Ottoman army defeat a coalition of Hungarian-Polish and Wallachian armies, ending a namesake crusade in which several powers attempted to stop Ottoman expansion into Europe. <u>A: VARNA</u>
