

POWERFUL


PATTY MCCORD

Must read for all managers.








REST




MAKE YOUR BED




THE PROPHET




FOUR THOUSAND WEEKS




LIFE'S AMAZING SECRETS




BRENE BROWN




THE CREATIVE ACT






NORWEGIAN WOOD




FIRST PERSON SINGULAR


PALESTINE




THE GHOST WORLD




EMBROIDERIES




UNFLATTENING




THE GIVER
