



DAY 1: CASABLANCA AIRPORT - CASABLANCA - RABAT

- Welcome to Casablanca airport by your driver, (who will be waiting for you at the exit with a sign in your name).
- Half day devoted to Casablanca city tour.
- Visit the famous Hassan II Mosque, which accommodates up to 25,000 worshippers; its minaret stands as the tallest religious structure in the world.
- Visit Royal Palace of Casablanca OUTSIDE:

The Royal Palace of Casablanca is a suitably grand abode for the King of Morocco when he's in town. Located in the Habous Quarter of the city's New Medina, this is the King's principal Casablanca residence and throughout the year hosts royal receptions.

Overnight at Casablanca hotel.

DAY 2: CASABLANCA - CHEFCHAOUEN - FEZ

- Breakfast at Casablanca hotel.
- Departure to Chefchaouen
- Half day devoted to explore Chefchaouen
- Get lost in the narrow blue streets of Chefchaouen. Take memorable pictures in the most famous spots of the Blue Pearl. Marvel at Chefchaouen famous narrow streets and stairs painted in a unique blue.
- Visit the most beautiful places in the city to take the best pictures for your Instagram.
- Continue to Fez.

Overnight at Fez hotel.

DAY 3: FEZ

- Breakfast at Fez hotel
- Day devoted to Fez city tour.
- Explore the narrow streets lined with shops selling fresh fruits, spices, intricately woven Berber carpets and numerous other art and craft items from Morocco.
- Visit the Quaraouiyine Mosque, founded in 859 by Fatima El Fihri and the Andalusian Mosque dating back to 860 (note that non-Muslims are not permitted to enter). Next, continue to the largest Tannerie Chouara where workers produce high-quality leather. You will also visit Islamic schools like Madrasa Bouanania, Moulay Idriss Mausoleum, and the iconic Nejjarine Fountain.
- During the tour, your guide will tell you the history, stories, and facts of the city. Finally, at the end of the tour, you will head back to your accommodation.
- Afternoon excursion to Meknes
- Discover the Bab Mansour Gate (closed for restrictions), the Royal Stables (closed for restrictions), and the Moulay Ismail Mausoleum.
- Return Fez
- Overnight at Fez hotel.

DAY 4: FEZ - MARRAKECH

- Breakfast at Fez hotel.
- Departure to Marrakech
- Evening at leisure to relax or explore nearby attractions.
- Overnight at Marrakech hotel.

DAY 5: MARRAKECH - TODRA GORGES - MERZOUGA DESER

- Breakfast at Marrakech hotel
- Departure to Merzouga
- En route, pass through the stunning Atlas Mountains, the Dades Valley, and the scenic Todra Gorge.
- Dinner & Overnight at Merzouga camp.

DAY 6: MERZOUGA

- Breakfast at Merzouga camp.
- Start the day with a sunrise camel ride (not included).
- Engage in thrilling activities like sandboarding, quad biking, and exploring the Erg Chebbi dunes. (Activities not included).

DAY 7: MERZOUGA - MARRAKECH

- Breakfast at Merzouga Camp.
- Departure to Marrakech.
- Overnight at Marrakech hotel.

DAY 8: MARRAKECH

- Breakfast at Marrakech hotel.
- Day devoted to Marrakech city tour.
- Marrakesh is the second oldest Imperial city, known as the Pearl of the South. The city was founded by the Almoravides at the end of the 11th century. The historical sightseeing includes:
- The Menara Garden is a large garden planted with olive trees, and at the heart of this garden, a large pond at the foot of a pavilion.
- The Koutoubia Mosque is a religious building built in the 12th century, its architecture and its ascetic decoration undergone the art of the Almohades from a height of 77 meters (253 feet).
- The Bahia Palace is an old 19th century palace of eight hectares in Islamic style. Currently a museum.
- The Médersa (or Madrasa) Ben Youssef was the largest Koranic university of its time. Built in the 16th century, it is a perfect example of typical Arab-Andalusian architecture. It still welcomes students wishing to learn Koranic theology and still enjoys an excellent reputation.
- Visit the Mellah and the Jewish quarter, the narrow streets of Mellah were once home to the residences of the city's Jewish population, as evidenced by several sites of interest such as the Salat Al Azama synagogue, with its tiled courtyard and exhibits on Jewish life, and the peaceful Miaara Jewish cemetery.
- Visit the souks and handicraft quarters, displaying a variety of items and the famous place Djemaa El Fna with its nonstop entertainment.
- Visit of Majorelle Garden.
- Visiting Le Jardin Majorelle in Marrakech is one of the best things to do in Marrakech. This enchanting attraction is iconic nowadays, and is most definitely one of the most visited spots in the Marrakech.
- Experience a relaxing Hammam (Optional: Start from 85€ per person)
- Hammam and scrub with black soap with eucalyptus and Ghassoul wrap plus shampoo, soaping and moisturizing with argan oil.
- Overnight at Marrakech hotel.
