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## Introduction

During the year local problems have included infestations of rats and overgrown and neglected properties. Neighbours suffer and the two often go together. Your association has been closely involved in having these matters dealt with.

All local planning applications are scrutinised so that the association can ensure that everyone concerned has been notified, in case they wish to object, and also to have an overview on the impact on the neighbourhood. Without close local knowledge it is not always possible to see which neighbours are affected. As concerned locals we also monitor the progress of the work.

The town centre is not part of our network but it affects us all since we live so close. 51 College Road [the old post office] is an exciting new development – the official planning application for 318 flats, cafes and retail units has just gone in. GMRA has commented during the consultations and will continue to monitor progress.

Due to the efforts of the road representatives membership numbers remain steady although there is a slight drop due to the number of rented properties. It is thanks to people continuing to pay their subscription that we have a voice with the council.

### **IDENTITY FRAUD**

Fraud is when trickery is used to gain a dishonest advantage, often financial, over another person.

Identity theft is when your personal details are stolen and identity fraud is when those details are used to commit fraud.

Individual Fraud could be any fraud that targets a person directly.

On line Fraud is when fraudsters rely on the internet to commit their crimes.

#### SUPPORT AND PREVENTION

You can sign up for FREE ACTION FRAUD ALERT to receive direct, verified, accurate information about scams and fraud in your area by email, recorded message or text message.

If you are a victim of fraud there is a network of support and information available to you.

#### **PREVENTION**

DO NOT GIVE any personal information (name, address, bank details, email or phone number) to organisations or people before verifying their credentials.

Many frauds start with a phishing email. Remember banks and financial institutions will NEVER send you an email asking you to link in and confirm bank details. Do NOT trust such emails even if they look genuine. You can always call your bank using the phone number on a genuine piece of correspondence.

Destroy and shred receipts with your card details and post with your name and address.

Ensure your computer has an up to date anti-virus software and a firewall installed. Ensure your browser is set to the highest level of security.

You should regularly get a report of your credit file. Experian and Equifax offer this service for a fee of £2.00 and £3.00. Please check their websites for more information.

If you are a victim of fraud, beware of fraudsters pretending to be lawyers to assist you. Advice is free from Action line Fraud 0300 123 2040

Talking about Fraud, please do not entertain any phone calls purporting to be from Microsoft Certified Partners, Symantec (Norton) or out of the blue calls which tell you that your PC is infected/slow and they will sort it out free by taking control of your computer remotely. Just tell them you do not use any computers.

These fraudsters will plant a virus or Trojan on your computer. Then they will ask you to pay a big amount by Western union or Debit card. Once you pay, your money is lost forever. Being a Computer Technician one comes across a lot of people stung by this scam. When you have a problem on your Computer, find a reputable Technician in your area. Be alert and don't be a victim of easy or free solutions.

We have a bin next to the Bench on Bonnersfield Lane.




#### **Cumberland Hotel Demolition**

## **Greenhill Burglaries**


Here is the chart with the latest burglary figures for Greenhill – unfortunately rather higher for January 2015!

The chart below shows how the number of burglaries in the whole of Greenhill has changed through the last two years. It should be noted that Greenhill extends past the town centre as far as Bessborough Road.



These figures were produced by the Metropolitan Police. They show the number of burglaries for every 1,000 people.
