- Ensure the property has a working safety switch installed on all circuits by a licensed electrician.
- Schedule regular electrical inspections to identify and address potential safety hazards.
- Provide a fire extinguisher and blanket in the kitchen, ensuring they are accessible and compliant.
- Share an evacuation plan with tenants, highlighting emergency exits and assembly points.
- Inspect the property for structural issues like cracks, damaged stairs, or loose railings.
- Ensure windows and doors are secure, functional, and accessible during emergencies.
- Arrange regular pest control services to manage termites, rodents, and other infestations.
- Conduct asbestos checks for older properties and address any hazards professionally.
- Install a compliant pool fence with self-closing gates and ensure safety barriers meet QLD laws.
- Display a CPR sign near the pool and conduct regular checks to maintain safety standards.
- Install interconnected, photoelectric smoke alarms in all bedrooms, hallways, and on every story.
- Test alarms annually, replace batteries yearly, and ensure alarms comply with Queensland regulations.
