







Who is Jesus


The Gospels

Some, like Matthew and John, were Jesus's disciples and saw everything he did. Others, like Luke and Mark, talked to many people who knew Jesus to get all the details correct.


Luke

Many people told stories about Jesus, but Luke wanted to write them down carefully. He wanted everyone to know the real truth! Luke acted like a detective, gathering stories and checking facts. He looked at other books and talked to people who knew Jesus. Then, he wrote his own book, so everyone could read the true story of Jesus.

Jesus: The Word


John starts his book by saying, "In the beginning was the Word," meaning Jesus was with God from the very start. Imagine "the Word" is like God's special message or plan, and that message *is* Jesus! Just like we use words to talk and share ideas, God used Jesus to show us who He is. Jesus is God's way of telling us, "I love you!"


A Surprise for Zechariah


John is Born!


Young Jesus at the Temple




John Prepares the Way

Jesus Gets Baptized






Jesus is Tested




Philip and Nathanael Meet Jesus


The Galilean Wedding


Cleaning God's House


A Teacher of Teachers


Woman at the Well

Matthew 4:12, Mark 1:14-15, Luke 4:14-15, Luke 4:16-30, John 4:43-45






Jesus Reads in Nazareth


Jesus and the Scary Spirit

Matthew 8:18-27, Mark 4:35-41, Luke 8:22-25






Jesus Helps Man in Graveyard

Matthew 9:18-26, Mark 5:21-43, Luke 8:40-56






Jesus Helps the Blind and Deaf

Matthew 9:27-34






A Man Lowered Through the Roof

Matthew 9:1-8, Mark 2:1-12, Luke 5:17-26






Jesus Eats with Sinners

Why Jesus's Disciples Didn't Fast




Honoring the Father




Eating on the Sabbath

Matthew 12:1-8, Mark 2:23-28, Luke 6:1-5






Jesus Heals on the Sabbath!

Matthew 12:9-21, Mark 3:1-12, Luke 6:6-11






Jesus Chooses His Special Helpers!


Jesus Teaches on a Hill!

Matthew 5:1 - 7:29, Luke 6:17-49






A Soldier's Great Faith

Matthew 8:5-13, Luke 7:1-10






Jesus Raises a Widow's Son


A Woman's Loving Tears


Jesus and His Disciples




Jesus Teaches Parables

Matthew 13:1-23, Mark 4:1-20, Luke 8:4-15






Parable of the Lamp

Jesus said, "Would you hide a lamp under a bowl?" Of course not! You put it where everyone can see its light. What is hidden will be shown, and what is secret will be brought out. Pay attention to what you hear. The more you give, the more you will receive. So, let your light shine for everyone!

Parable of the Growng Seed

Jesus told a story about a farmer who scattered seeds. Then he slept and went about his days. The seeds sprouted and grew tall all by themselves! First, a little shoot, then a head, and finally, full grain. When the grain was ready, the farmer harvested it. This is how God's kingdom grows – in its own way and time, without us fully understanding how!


Parable of the Wheat and Tares

A farmer planted good seeds. But a bad guy secretly planted yucky weed seeds in the same field! The good wheat and the bad weeds grew up together. The farmer said, "Let them both grow until it's time to gather." Then, the weeds will be thrown away, and the good wheat will be kept safe. This shows that good and bad will be together until the end.

Matthew 13:24-30






Wheat and Tares Explained

Jesus said the farmer with good seeds is him. The good seeds (wheat) are his followers. The bad guy with weed seeds is the devil, and those seeds (tares) are his followers. When the world ends, angels will take away the bad weeds and burn them. But Jesus's followers will shine like the sun in God's special place forever!

Parable of the Mustard Seed

Jesus told about a tiny mustard seed, the smallest seed you can imagine! But when it's planted, it grows into a huge plant, bigger than all the garden plants. It becomes like a tree, and birds can even come and make nests in its branches. This shows that even small beginnings can grow into something big and amazing, just like God's kingdom!

Matthew 13:31-32, Mark 4:30-32, Luke 13:18-19






Parable of the Yeast

Jesus said God's kingdom is like yeast that a woman mixed into a big bowl of flour. Even though you can't see the yeast working much at first, it slowly spreads through all the dough. Little by little, the yeast makes the whole batch of dough rise and become big and fluffy bread! So, even small things can have a big impact for God.

Parable of the Hidden Treasure

Jesus said God's kingdom is like finding treasure hidden in a field! A person finds it and is so happy that they hide it again. Then, they sell everything they have to buy that field. This shows that God's kingdom is so amazing and valuable that it's worth giving up everything to have it!

Matthew 13:44






Parable of the Costly Pearl

Jesus said God's kingdom is also like a merchant looking for beautiful pearls. When he finds one pearl that is super special and worth more than anything else, he sells everything he owns to buy it! This shows that God's kingdom is like that amazing pearl – it's so precious that having it is worth more than anything in the whole world!

Matthew 13:45-46






Parable of the Net

Jesus said God's kingdom is like a big fishing net thrown into the lake. It catches all sorts of fish, good and bad. When the net is full, the fishermen pull it to shore and sort the fish, keeping the good ones and throwing away the bad ones. It will be the same at the end of the world: the bad people will be separated from the good.

Matthew 13:47-50








Jesus's Bigger Family

Jesus was busy teaching when someone said, "Your mother and brothers are outside." Jesus looked at everyone listening and said, "These are my mother and brothers! Anyone who does what God wants is my brother, sister, and mother." This shows that following God makes you part of Jesus's very own family – a big and special family!

Sad Surprise in His Hometown

Jesus went back to his hometown and taught in their church. The people were amazed! They asked, "Where did this man get such wisdom and power? Isn't he just the carpenter's son?" They were surprised and didn't believe in him. Jesus said that people respect a prophet everywhere except in their own hometown. Because they didn't believe, Jesus didn't do many powerful things there.

Jesus Helps Everyone

Jesus traveled to all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues and healing every sickness. He saw the crowds and felt sorry for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus told his disciples to pray for more workers to help these people. After this, Jesus sent his twelve helpers out to teach in the towns.

Matthew 9:35-38, 11:1, Mark 6:6












Jesus Sends His Disciples

Jesus sent his twelve friends, the disciples, to tell people about God's kingdom. He told them to heal sick people and tell everyone that God's kingdom is near. Anyone who helps Jesus's friends is like helping Jesus himself!


John the Baptist Loses His Head

King Herod was angry with John the Baptist for telling him it was wrong to marry Herodias. So, Herod put John in prison. At Herod's birthday party, Herodias's daughter danced and pleased him so much that he promised her anything she wanted. Her mother told her to ask for John's head on a plate, and sadly, Herod did it.

King Herod Antipas heard about all the amazing things Jesus was doing. Some people thought Jesus was John the Baptist, who Herod had chopped off his head! Herod felt guilty and scared. He thought John had come back to life and was doing these powerful miracles. This shows that even powerful people can be afraid when they do wrong things.


Jesus Heals in Gennesaret


Clean Hands, Clean Hearts


Jesus Heals a Deaf Man


Another Big Meal!


Jesus Heals a Blind Man Slowly


The Narrow Door


Choosing Jesus


The Rich Young Man


Parable of the Vineyard Workers


Jesus Tells About His Death


Who Is the Greatest?


Parable of the Ten Talents


Lazarus Lives Again!


Planning to Stop Jesus


Planning Against Jesus


Judas Agrees to Betray Jesus


Everyone Will Leave, But Peter Denies






Jesus' Hard Prayer




The Crowd Chooses Barabbas


Soldiers Mock Jesus




Witnesses at the Cross


Spear in Jesus' Side


Jesus Is Buried


Guards Watch the Tomb; A Lie Spreads

He Is Risen!


