


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Oh , thanks !

TIPS FOR PARENTS

- Explain age limits and inappropriate content. Many online sites or games have a minimum age restriction. Explain to your child that age limits exist to protect them from content that might not be suitable.

- **Set Ground Rules**

Talk to your child and find out what things they like to do online. Agree on websites, apps and games that are best for them to use.

- **Be calm and reassuring**

Let your child know that they can talk to you or a trusted adult if they come across unsuitable content.

- **Encourage Critical Thinking**

Help your child to think about what activities they should or should not do when they are online.

- **Talk about positive ways to use technology and the digital world**

Show your child that you understand the role of technology and the internet in their lives.
