

# Churn Dash

12" x 12" Finished

These instructions are provided as a resource for the RBD Building Blocks video series found on our YouTube channel.

In this new video series, Cindy teaches you how to make nine, 12" finished beginner-friendly quilt blocks.

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## Cutting Instructions

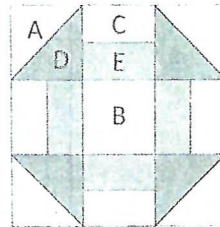
Cloud: A- two 5" squares

B- one 4½" square

C- four 2½" x 4½" rectangles or one 2½" x 20" strip

Clover: D- two 5" squares

Grass: E- four 2½" x 4½" rectangles or one 2½" x 20" strip



## Sewing Instructions

1. Place a C rectangle and an E rectangle right sides together (RST) and sew along the long edge to make a C/E unit (4½" x 4½"). Repeat to make 4 C/E units.

OR

Place a C strip and an E strip RST and sew along the long edge. Press. Cut the strip set into 4 segments 4½" x 4½".

2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the two A squares.
3. Place one A square and one D square RST. Sew ¼" seam on each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line and press open for two half square triangles (HSTs). Repeat to make four HSTs. Trim to 4½" x 4½".
4. Lay out the quilt block using the four A HSTs, four D/E units, and one B square. Sew together in rows. Sew the rows together to complete the Churn Dash Block (12½" x 12½").

Fussy Cutting: The method in which motifs or elements are cut specifically from a fabric, in order to highlight a design or pattern featured in the finished quilt block.
