The Zip File

Two PDF print files are included in the download pack, differing only in their page sizes. There are 7 pages to print. The US version is "Letter" and the Rest of World version is "A4". These need to be printed in colour.

The game is most faithfully played when printed on top quality thick transparent printer paper. If you prefer to print on non-transparent paper, then you should use a good quality thick white paper (preferably metric 200-400 GSM, or Imperial 120+ lbs), and glossy or satin paper looks best.

The best look for the links is cutting to shape, although this can take time. I used an art knife, which Americans usually refer to as a hobby knife, for accuracy and speed. The pack contains 4 sets of gemstones, but if you are playing the 2- or 4-player games, then you will only need 2.

There is a separate PDF scoring sheet which is handy if you play the game a lot, there are separate pages for 2-player and 3-player games. A 4-player game would use the 2-player game scoring sheet. There is a set of rules in another PDF which is 7 pages long.

There are no additional game piece requirements although it might be useful to have boxes or envelopes in which to place the separated stock of bronze, silver and gold links, and the separate stocks of player gemstones.
