What It Is

A water interactive station is a small, themed setup that invites attendees to explore a specific water-related topic through quick activities, visuals, or dialogue. It's not a booth or a lecture—it's a micro-engagement that sparks curiosity and connection.

Core Purpose

- Educate: Share bite-sized insights on water issues, innovations, or cultural practices.
- Engage: Encourage participants to interact—write, vote, test, or reflect.
- Connect: Foster dialogue between attendees, even across sectors or regions.

10-Minute Format

Each station is designed to be:

- Self-guided or lightly facilitated
- Quick to absorb (2–3 key points or questions)
- Visually appealing (infographics, props, or digital elements)
- Actionable (e.g. "Write your idea," "Test this tool," "Share your story")
