Ethiopia is facing an unprecedented crisis, one of the most critical moments in its long history. The country's sovereignty is at risk, by ethnic federalism supported by the constitution accelerating the nation toward instability and collapse. What we do is:

- 1. Uphold National Unity and Sovereignty
- 2. To support and assist those who have begun resisting oppression, violence, ethnic discrimination, displacement, forced eviction by authorities, massacres, and war, and to oppose and bring to justice the perpetrators of such injustices.
- 3. Advocate for governance that prioritizes citizenship over identity-based divisions.
- 4. We demand to end all wars and hostilities in all regions.
- 5. We demand the release of all political prisoners of conscience.
- 6. Revise the current Ethiopian constitution based on Ethnic Federalism primary cause for most conflicts
- 7. Uphold the rule of Law and Judicial independence
- 8. Protect fundamental Freedoms and Human Rights.
- **9**. Establish a democratic system in Ethiopia where institutions function freely and fairly.
- 10. To uphold the rule of law and expand access to justice, ensuring judicial institutions operate independently.
- 11. To foster shared social, cultural, economic, and political values and agreements, while preserving diversity, enabling Ethiopians to live in unity across regions in peace.
- 12. To promote respect for all ethnic groups, languages, religions, and cultural traditions.
- 13. Guarantee freedom of belief and language. Reverse recent efforts to weaken Amharic, language spoken by most Ethiopians.
- 14. To help the Ethiopian people overcome poverty, achieve better economic opportunities, and improve education and their quality of life.
