- God's promise of peace to the exiles—whose city and temple lay in ruins—was not through circumstances or human strength, but through a child, the Prince of Peace.
- While we won't have world peace in this lifetime, we can have peace in our souls now: "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts". To have the internal peace promised by the Prince of Peace, we must let Him rule and reign in our lives, surrendering our thoughts and lives to Him moment by moment.
