"God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21). Through His resurrection, He clothes us with His beauty and righteousness. The manger begins this exchange; the cross completes it.

(Isaiah 61:7; Ephesians 2:3; Romans 5:20; Hebrews 12:2; 1 Peter 1:3-4)
