### 1. REASONS FOR PRAISE & WORSHIP

(Psalms 95:4-5,7; 96:9,10,13; 100:3,5; see also Revelation 4:8)

Notes: .....

- Each attribute gives us reason to bow before Him with thanksgiving and praise. Worship is not about us but about who God is and what He has done.
- What attribute of God moves you most deeply to worship Him today?

### 2. ATTITUDES IN PRAISE & WORSHIP

(Psalms 95:1-2; 100:2,4; see also Isaiah 61:3; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Notes: .....

- Worship is to be marked by joy, thanksgiving, and reverence. We come not passively or distracted but expectantly, with hearts tuned to praise. Even in hardship, we can put on “the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness.”
- How can you come before God with greater joy and reverence this week?

### 3. EXPRESSIONS IN PRAISE & WORSHIP

(Psalms 95:1,5,6; 96:1-3,8-13; 100:1,2; 134:2; 2 Samuel 24:24; Exodus 19:16-19)

Notes: .....

- Worship engages both our voices and our bodies. We can sing, shout, lift our hands, dance, bow, kneel, give offerings, and proclaim His salvation. These outward expressions flow from inward surrender and remind us that worship is our whole life lived before Him.
- What new or renewed expression of worship could you offer to the Lord this week?

**Closing Prayer:** Lord, You are our Creator, King, Shepherd, and Judge. Tune our hearts to sing Your praise with joy, reverence, and gratitude. May our worship this week honor You in spirit and in truth. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.
