

Let's Write a Jingle

Write a WHAT?

A short song used in advertising to help customers connect with companies. The best jingles are catchy, making the product easy to remember. Interesting Fact:

The writing world needs **bookworms**.

The jingle industry wants <mark>earworms</mark>.



That's what is created with the combination of a simple, "catchy" musical beat, a good rhyme, and plenty of repetition. The earworm digs into our brains and makes it almost impossible to get the jingle out of our heads.

The shorter and simpler the melody, the more likely it is to get stuck in your head – that's why some of the most common earworms are jingles.

A Jingle MUST be....

CATCHY: Think toe-tappin', finger-snappin, hand-clappin' beats.

LIKEABLE: NOT annoying

MEMORABLE: Listener should still be "hearing" the jingle hours, days, weeks...maybe even years later.



IT'S TIME TO WRITE YOUR OWN **SIMPLE JINGLE** (preferably one with a romantic slant, since this conference is all about romance.)

Not a test. Not mandatory. Just for fun.

Make it catchy, likeable and memorable.

Use the ETR method: Keep it simple Good rhythm Plenty of rhyme

You have 10 minutes.

Did You Know?

Barry Manilow wrote jingles for a ⁴ number of companies during the '60s and '70s, including:

- McDonald's
- Stridex
- Dodge
- Band-Aid (Yessirree, Manilow wrote the music to "Stuck on Me")

He's also responsible for **State Farm's "Like a Good Neighbor,"** which he wrote in the '70s. The insurance company still uses the jingle in their commercials today, but Manilow doesn't receive royalties for it. He sold off his rights as the songwriter to State Farm, who **only paid him \$500** for the jingle. • Toys 'R' Us introduced their now-famous jingle in the early 1980s. <u>Linda Kaplan Thaler</u> and Author James Patterson co-created the jingle.

- Before he won numerous Emmys, Grammys, and Oscars, <u>Randy Newman</u> wrote commercial jingles. He co-wrote "The Most Original Soft Drink Ever" and "Be a Pepper" with Barry Manilow and Jake Holmes (a commercial composer who wrote "Be All That You Can Be" for the U.S. Army) for Dr. Pepper's marketing campaigns.
- In 1962, Richard Trentlage entered a contest sponsored by J. Walter Thompson, the largest advertising company in the U.S. at the time. With the help of his children, whom he had sing the lyrics, his jingle for "I Wish I Were an Oscar Meyer Wiener" became a worldwide phenomenon. Trentlage went on to create many other memorable jingles, such as "Buckle Up for Safety" which was used for a national safety belt educational campaign. JINGLE/9
