Statehouse Happenings

Ohio legislators were busy in March working on the state's biennium budgets. The transportation budget (HB 54) passed in the House in February and the Senate spent much of March with lengthy hearings and drafting amendments. They passed Am. Sub. HB 54 on the 19th and the house concurred on the same day. It was then sent to Governor DeWine and he signed it March 31 without any lines vetoed. It will go into effect on July 1. It does not have anything directly affecting our veterans or Ohio's military. It creates funding for critical transportation infrastructure projects across the state.

The operating budget (HB 96) continues to have hearings. It is still in the house, but is required to be signed by Governor DeWine by June 30.

Two new bills were introduced in the house and one bill and one resolution in the senate. (See page six) They bring the total number of veteran/military pieces of legislation in this general assembly to 13 for the house and 10 for the senate. Committee hearing continued throughout the month.

March 3 - 7

The House Veterans and Military Development Committee met

Wednesday morning and heard a presentation from American Legion Department of Ohio's Jacob Brault, their Legislative and National Security Director. He informed the committee about the Legion's Four Pillars, their purpose and the various programs under each pillar. Brault concluded his presentation with a list of the Department's legislative goals for the General Assembly and Congress.

That same morning in the House Ways and Means Committee House Bill 22 had its second hearing. Only written proponent testimony had been received. They were from Secretary of State Frank LaRose, a Gold Star Spouse whose husband had been killed in Iraq in 2005, and the great grandson of two Gold Star Mothers. HB 22 would authorize a full homestead exemption for surviving spouses of members of the uniformed services killed in the line of duty. It was introduced by Representatives Brian Lorenz (HD-60) and David Thomas (HD-65).

In the afternoon the Senate Armed Services, Veterans Affairs and Public Safety Committee met. On the agenda were SR 21, SR 22, and SCR 7. It was the third hearing for SR 21 and SR 22. Both resolutions were sponsored by Senator Tim Schaffer (SD-20). SR 21 would urge Congress to support the provision of prompt and

comprehensive mental health treatment to military personnel and veterans who are suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder and other service-related stress disorders. SR 22 would urge the President, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and Congress to take prompt action to reduce the processing time for veterans' disability benefit claims. There was no testimony oral or written for either resolution. Both resolutions unanimously passed favorably out of Committee. SR 21 was adopted by the full senate on the 26th.

SCR 7 had a second hearing. The concurrent resolution would urge Congress to reissue Department of Defense Civilian Retiree Identification Cards and was introduced by Senator **Kyle Koehler** (SD-10) on February 10. Testimony was provided by four retired DOD workers —one oral and three written, in support of SCR 7.

March 10 - 14

The House Transportation Committee met Tuesday afternoon with HB 27 and HB 50 on the agenda. It was the first hearing for both bills. House

Bill 27 was introduced January 28 and would designate the bridge spanning the Grand River in Lake County as the "Specialist Jacob A. Ashton Memorial Bridge."

Testimony was provided by the bill sponsors, Representatives **Jamie Callender** (HD-57) and **Daniel P. Troy** (HD-23). Ashton was a resident of Perry, OH and enlisted in the Army following graduation from Perry



State Rep Holds Mini Townhall at Local VFW

Parma, OH - There were quite a few veterans in attendance when State Representative Sean P. Brennan (standing in blue shirt) held a mini townhall meeting at their VFW Post. He gave them and other constituents an update on issues before the general assembly and bill he has sponsored.

High School. He deployed to Iraq in 2023. In August 2024, less than five months before his enlistment would end, he was found murdered in the barracks parking lot at Fort Drum in New York. He was 21 years old.

House Bill 50 would designate a portion of State Route 47 in Darke County as the "PFC John

Wayne Richard Memorial Highway." It was introduced February 4 by Representative **Angela N. King** (HD-84). John Wayne Richard, born and raised in Versailles, Ohio and after graduating from high school he enlisted in the Army and was deployed to Vietnam. In the early morning hours of May 21, 1969, Richard and five

other soldiers were in a night defensive position when they came under attack from enemy forces on three sides. Richard and four of his fellow soldiers, lost their lives in the engagement according to King's testimony.

House Bills 27 and 50 were both passed favorably out of committee with unanimous votes. On March 26, HB 27 passed on the house floor with a 95 to 0 vote. On the 19th of March HB 50 passed on the house floor. The vote was 92 to 0.

On Wednesday HB 40 and HB 22 were on the agenda in the House Ways and Means Committee. HB 22 had its third hearing but there was no written or oral testimony offered. That was not the case, however with HB 40, up for its second hearing. The bill would increase the enhanced homestead exemption for certain disabled veterans. It was introduced February 3 by Representatives **Tracy M. Richardson**

March 17 - 21

This week there was only one veteran/military bill scheduled for a hearing. It was House Bill 40 for its third hearing in the House Ways and Means Committee. There was no one attending to testify in opposition to the bill and no written testimony was received.

March 24 - 28

During the last week of the month there was only one veteran/military bill to get a hearing. It was the first hearing for

hearing. It was the first hearing for Senate Bill 148. Senator Jerry C. Cirino (SD-18), the bill's sponsor, introduced it on March 18 and provided sponsor testimony before the Senate Transportation Committee. SB 148 would designate a portion of State Route 2 in Lake

County as the "Specialist Lloyd Andrew Sellers Memorial Highway." Sellers, a native of Euclid, Ohio was drafted into the army in 1966 and began a tour in Vietnam in January 1967. On June 19, 1967, he was killed in action. He left behind a 19-year-old wife and a 5-month-old son. He was 21.

Make sure you are ready for the upcoming Ohio Primary Election. 1] Make sure you are registered to vote. You can check online at the Ohio Secretary of State website (see 'Helpful Links' on page one). There you can register, check to verify that you are registered, make changes to your registration – new address or a name change. 2] Know what is acceptable at the polling place so you have the correct ID and don't get turned away. 3] Get to know who is running and be ready to vote intelligently.

Monday April 7: Deadline for voter registration for May 6 primary/special election.

Tuesday April 8: Absentee Voting by mail begins.

<u>Tuesday April 8:</u> Early In-Person Voting begins.

<u>Tuesday May 6:</u> Primary/Special Election Day. Polls open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

LEGISLATION INTRODUCED IN MARCH

HB 171 Introduced on March 12 by Representative Jean Schmidt (HD-62).

The Bill would enact section 5534.673 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 28 in Clermont County as the "CPT Louis John Speidel Memorial Highway."

It was referred to the House Transportation Committee.

SB 148 Introduced on March 18 by Senator Jerry C. Cirino (SD-18).

The bill would enact section 5534.675 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 2 in Lake County as the "Specialist Lloyd Andrew Sellers Memorial Highway."

It was referred to the Senate Transportation Committee.

SR 52 Introduced on March 18 by Senator **Tim Schaffer** (SD-20).

The resolution will Honoring the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution Elizabeth Sherman Reese Chapter on its One Hundred Twenty-fifth Anniversary.

It was adopted by the Senate on the same day.

HB 204 Introduced on March 26 by Representatives Erika White (HD-41) and Melanie Miller (HD-67).

The bill would enact section 5.212 of the Revised Code to designate March 9th as "6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion Day."

It has not been referred to a committee yet.

A bill is a document by which a member of the General Assembly proposes to enact a new law or amend or repeal an existing law. The term "bill" is used to refer to the document from the time it is drafted and delivered to the member until it is considered and approved by both the House and the Senate. After passing both houses, a bill becomes an "act" and must be presented to the Governor for acceptance or rejection. If accepted, or if the Governor does not take any action for ten days, it becomes

Details on every bill can be found on the Ohio Legislature website. You can also check the status of bills as they travel thorough committees and sessions, check to see how the voting went, and read the testimonies of witnesses.

To find a bill put the bill number (i.e. SB 712 or HB 943) into the search bar and go from there.
