APPLIANCES & LINES	
Familiarize yourself with the location of tanks, lines, and shut-off valv	es.

Have a certified HVAC or propane service inspect your furnace, stove annually.	e, and connections
C Keep tanks and lines accessible; clear snow, ice, and shrubbery regul	arly.
DETECTORS & SAFETY	
Install propane and carbon monoxide detectors in recommended lood detector (placed low), CO detector (placed mid/high)	cations: Propane
Test detectors monthly and replace batteries or units per manufacti	urer instructions.
Consider multiple detectors in larger cabins for redundancy.
