Fun and games at The Kebab Konnection!

The Kebab Konnection has been open since October 2023 but the current owners of the business, Gurjeet Singh and Mandeep Kaur, have been running it since January 2024. Since then, they have received amazing feedback on their food and service. On Google Reviews, they have an average rating of 4.9 out of 5 from 278 reviews. Similarly, they have been featured on the Restaurant Guru website and ranked 162 out of 1771 restaurants in Christchurch, placing them in the top 10% of places in the city.



The Kebab Konnection's popularity is easy to understand. Gurjeet and Mandeep both have significant expertise in Middle Eastern cuisine. Mandeep worked in a Greek restaurant in Cyprus for four years and Gurjeet worked in a kebab restaurant on Auckland's North Shore for one and a half years. At the Kebab Konnection the pair specialise in authentic Mediterranean and Turkish cuisine. Their salads are always fresh, meat is prepared on a doner machine, and they will be shortly acquiring an authentic barbecue grill, which will use coal to cook the food and impart its unique flavours.

The shop's opening hours are Wednesdays - Mondays, 10am - 5am, and Tuesdays, 5pm – 5am. These hours mean the business can cater to airport workers, tourists, warehouse workers from The Warehouse and Kmart in Papanui, university students, and – via Uber Eats and Door Dash - anyone in the city who craves a high quality kebab in the early morning. How are you doing?

Very well thank you, although I am slightly nervous as I'm taking part in the Coast to Coast race on Saturday.

That was a great experience but I'm someone who loves being in the outdoors so I was keen to return to New Zealand. After a year in the big city I left the UK, returned to Pak'nSave Invercargill and then eventually on to New World Balclutha.

Why did you move to Christchurch?

I was fortunate to be approved to purchase New World

Bishopdale and my partner's family are based here. Christchurch was also very appealing for its access to the great outdoors!

How are you finding Bishopdale?

Great. There is a real sense of community here in Bishopdale. The team at the store are fantastic, as are the customers. I'm really enjoying meeting the locals while out on the shop floor.

Do you have any big plans for the store?

We have a lot of exciting plans for New World Bishopdale. The great thing about this industry is the fast-pace and consistent development. We are looking forward to continuously improving our customers' shopping experience.

What do you like doing in your spare time?

I used to play rugby at school and at university but after dislocating both of my shoulders I gave it up! Nowadays I really enjoy multi-sport, events such as Coast to Coast, triathlons and Ironman racing. I enjoy the mental challenge of these events and keeping fit!

Take a walk on the bright side

The Bishopdale Tramping Club has been operating since May 1985 and arranges a full day tramp each Wednesday.

The day is structured, though informal, and provides exercise, fresh air and great companionship with an emphasis on safety. We usually have two groups of trampers so that one group can choose a less demanding alternative to the main tramp.

We tramp over a wide range of tracks on public reserves, regional parks, forests and private farmland throughout Christchurch, Mid and North Canterbury. Each week we walk in stunning New Zealand countryside and marvel at the views of sea, rivers and streams, hills and snowy mountains, limestone rock structures, native bush and trees – often listening to birdsong.



Our point of difference to other clubs is that we use a bus for transport to/from walks. This means we aren't restricted to loop tracks; having to car pool; or have the risk of leaving unattended vehicles in remote areas.

Each Wednesday, our bus leaves the car park at Bishopdale at 8:30am (or occasionally at 8:00am), returning by about 5pm. One alternative pickup/dropoff point is also offered each week, with its location dependent on that day's tramp. We have members living all over Christchurch.

The club operates a pay as you go system and trampers pay a fee online for the particular tramps they join. If you have a reasonable level of fitness, are capable of walking on hills and would like to join us on a tramp, go to <u>bishopdaletrampers.org.nz</u> for more information.

How to check your credit record

A credit report (or record) is a chronicle of your financial journey. It includes any payment defaults etched against your name and reveals your credit rating.

Your credit rating is a score ranging from 0 to 1,000, bestowed upon you by credit reporting agencies, based on your credit history. The higher your score, the more favourable your rating is. Businesses, banks and landlords may peruse your credit report to ascertain their willingness to engage in business with you.

You are entitled to free access to your credit record, and typically it will arrive within 10 days of applying for it. Should you desire it sooner (within three working days), a fee may apply. A credit reporting agency cannot charge you more than \$10 (inclusive of GST) for processing your request.

For a full check, apply to each of these agencies: Centrix, illion and Equifax.

They offer kebabs, souvlaki, and burgers and produce six of their own homemade sauces, which now outsell the ordinary sauces found at most kebab shops. They are one of the few places in the city with haloumi on the menu.

They have also introduced ways to make eating at the shop more fun. For example, Mondays feature 'Hit the Bullseye' offers, where with every purchase customers get a chance to throw a dart at a dartboard and win prizes! If you hit the bulleye, you get 50% off your purchase; hitting the outer ring wins you a 40% discount. You can also win a drink, a side dish, baklava and other prizes by hitting any white area of the dartboard. If you can't get to the shop on Mondays you can always take advantage of the day specials, signature dishes that only cost \$9.99 each.

Gurjeet and Mandeep have said that local Bishopdale people have been a great support to the business, for which they are very grateful. Regular customers appeared from the very start and were a great help in establishing the business in its early days. Next time you're at the mall pop in and find out why customers keep coming back.

Staff indicated that most of the technology equipment at the centre was way overdue for replacement and in urgent need of an upgrade, including their Wi-Fi


system, laptops, ipads and Technology Assisted Learning Equipment.


