Bishopdale Pharmacy celebrates 60 years of serving the community

Bishopdale Pharmacy has been in the heart of the Bishopdale community now for 60 years.

Bishopdale Shopping Centre officially opened in 1966 but the "pioneers" of the Bishopdale shopping community in 1965 included the Bishopdale Pharmacy (originally called the Chemist) and the shops on either side of it, the Bishopdale Butchery and a Books and Toy shop.

The shopping precinct was originally developed by what was then the Ministry of Works, and is based on a similar concept that had been developed slightly earlier in Porirua. The pharmacy took over and expanded into the site that had previously housed the bookshop in the early 2000s.

Unichem Bishopdale is locally owned and operated by a partnership of three women who have a longstanding association with both the Pharmacy and the local community.

While Amanda, one of the three pharmacist co-owners, has been an owner for the last 16 years, she technically has been involved for most of the life of the Pharmacy. Her father, Keith Nuttall, built the Pharmacy in 1965. Amanda and fellow co-owner Maria bought into the

Let's catch up with...

Mahmoud Wees, owner of 'Stylish Barber' at 11 Bishopdale Court



How are you doing?

I'm good thanks, but this is the first time I've been interviewed so I may need your help!

Are you a native Cantabrian?

No, I'm originally from Syria. I left with my mother and one of my elder brothers in 2011 at the start of the civil war. I was 14 years old at the time. We spent four years living in Thailand before arriving in New Zealand. For the first four years we lived in Dunedin, before moving to Christchurch five years ago. When I first arrived in the country I didn't know much English and my pronunciation and grammar were terrible! So I spent two years studying English at Otago Polytechnic.

What did you do then?

I got a job in an aluminium company making windows and doors. After working there for a year I realised that there were more employment opportunities in Christchurch so I moved. My mother and brother followed afterwards. I started my own business making customised furniture but it was badly affected by COVID and so unfortuately it had to close.

Is that when you learned to be a barber?

I'd actually done some training with a Dunedin barber before I moved to Christchurch, but I decided to do the one year course for the New Zealand Certificate in Commercial Barbering at Ara Institute. After I finished I opened my own barbering business and operated out of a truck for a year. I then looked for a retail space. One of my friends at Space Furniture in Bishopdale Mall said that I could use some of their space and I thought Bishopdale would be a good location for my shop. After I decorated the interior and kitted it out with all the necessary equipment, the shop opened at the beginning of May.

What services does the barber shop offer?

Hair cutting and styling, triming and styling of beards, and full face shaving with a straight razor. I do cut women's hair but only offer a basic hair. I don't colour, bleach or perm hair. Customers can walk in or make a booking on

022 488 9873. From the middle of August we are open Monday, Tuesday and Saturday 9am-5pm, and Wednesday, Thursday, Friday 9am-7pm.

How is business?

It's going well! I am getting a lot of repeat customers and good reviews on social media. Quite a few of my customers say that they didn't know that there was a barber in Bishopdale Mall but word is slowly spreading. I have two chairs here, so there is room for growth!

What do you like to do in your spare time?

I like learning new skills. I recently learned how to tile floors and would like to know more about car mechanics. However, I have a three year old daughter who keeps me busy so I don't have free time for any kind of studying.

Healthy Homes Standards

The Healthy Homes Standards are minimum standards for residential tenancies. They have been taking effect since 1 July 2021, and on 1 July 2025, they took full effect, covering all residential homes, including private rentals.

Most new or renewed residential tenancy agreements must include an up-to-date, signed Healthy Homes Standards compliance statement which tells you how well the rental property complies with the standards.

The compliance statement must say whether the rental property meets the standards for insulation, heating, ventilation, moisture and drainage, and draught-stopping.

If a rental property does not meet one of the standards, the landlord must give a valid reason for this in the Healthy Homes Standards compliance statement.

Briefly, the standards are that rental properties must:

- have one or more fixed heater/s that can directly heat the main living room.
- have insulation that meets the 2008 Building Code (or if there is existing insulation, it must be at least 120mm thick).
- have the right size extractor fans in kitchens and bathrooms. The living room, dining room, kitchen and bedrooms must each have at least one window, door or skylight that opens to the outside (and can be left open).
- have enough drainage and guttering to prevent water from getting inside the building.
- not have any unreasonable gaps or holes in walls, ceilings, windows, floors, and doors that cause noticeable draughts.

If your rented home does not meet the Healthy Homes Standards, and it is not exempt from them, your landlord could be in breach of the Residential Tenancies Act.

You should try talking to your landlord first. If they will not commit to making the home meet the standards - for example, by installing insulation - or you have waited too long for them to do so, you can give your landlord a 14-day notice to remedy.

If they have not made the changes to make your home meet the standards, or at least made reasonable progress towards this, you can apply to the Tenancy Tribunal for a remedy.


