The Ghost Brahman

- 1. Many years ago there lived a poor 'Non Kulin' Brahman .
- 2. Being a poor and not kulin, he could not find suitable bride.
- 3. At that time, grooms had to give a good deal of dowry to the Bride's parents.
- 4. Eventually he earned / bagged a great deal of money and got married.
- 5. After marriage he found difficulty in maintaining his family, so decided to go to city to earn.
- 6. On the way to city, he took rest **under a tree where lived a 'Bhoot'** who took the appearance / outlook / countenance (চেহারা) of the Brahman and entered the Brahman's house.
- 7. Neither his wife nor his mother could identify the ghost-Brahman being exactly same of the original Brahman.
- 8. **After few years** the original Brahman came back .
- 9. He became surprised to see his identical / twin in his own house.
- 10. Ghost Brahman gained the trust of everyone
- 11. Original Brahman went to the king and asked for justice.
- 12. Seeing the both Brahmans the king became confused and failed to decide who was original because both were indistinguishable / exactly had the same (হুবছ এক / অভিন্ন) face.
- 13. There lived a group of cowboys who often used to play king-king.
- 14. He noticed that the Brahman used to **cry after visiting the king's court** . He used to cry and mutter for justice .
- 15. The **king-cowboy wanted to solve the problem** of the Brahman and asked the King's permission to solve the case in king's court .
- 16. The original king allowed to see the case.
- 17. The king cowboy told the Brahman to bring bottle (phial) (সরু গলাওয়ালা বোতল)
- 18. Next day all were present at the court and the king cow-boy said that whoever of them would be able to enter into the bottle would be declared / decided the right person.
- 19. Original Brahman got angry after hearing this while ghost-Brahman easily accepted the challenge and got into the bottle in a shape of an insect.
- 20. King cow-boy told the original Brahman to cocked up / closed the bottle with a cork immediately and asked to throw into the sea.

21. In this way, the **neat-herd-king / the 'king cow-boy'** solved the problem.

Q & A

1. How did the Brahman manage to marry?

Ans - Being a poor and 'non-kulin', the Brahman faced tremendous difficulties to get married. He needed to arrange a good deal of money to give to the parents of the bride and to cover the wedding expense.

He went door to door, begging and wanting, flattering rich people to accumulate the fund for his marriage. After a lot of efforts he managed to succeed in collecting the required money for his marriage.

2. How did the real - Brahman get rid of the Ghost - Brahman?

Ans - When the real Brahman used to come back from the court of the king everyday without justice or any fruitful result, he used to pass by a place where a group of cow-boys used to play 'king-king'. One of the cowboys would be elected as 'king'. They also had a court under a tree. One day the king - cowboy noticed the Real - Brahman crying and passing by daily. He gave order to present the real - Brahman in his court. Brahman told the entire story about how the ghost captured / took over his entire household and even his identity. After hearing his whole story, the king - cowboy made a plan. He brought a narrow-necked bottle and told to get into the bottle to prove who was Real - Brahman. Having confidence, the Ghost - Brahman accepted the challenge and used his supernatural abilities. He turned himself into an insect and entered into the bottle.
