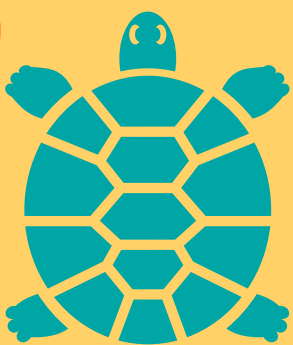
## Uruguay

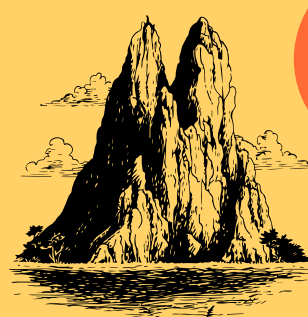


## The Bahamas
