

#### A Note from Your Increasingly Frustrated Handicap Chair

Hi everyone,

Further to my previous reminders, this month's message is a little less friendly and a lot more direct. Let's get right to it:

#### **How to Post Scores**

- Post the same day you play—no exceptions unless absolutely unavoidable.
- Post Hole-by-Hole—not just Front & Back, and definitely not just the Total.
   Tournament Scores: If you played in a club tournament, do not post your score. The Tournament Chair will handle it via Golf Genius. Duplicate entries waste hours of my time.

#### **Un-played Holes in Match Play**

• If your match ends on the 14th hole, you can stop—or keep playing because, hey, we love golf! Most of us finish the round. But let's be honest: some use the last few holes to "balance out" a hot start. A few have even been caught 4-putting from 5 feet while joking about "handicap maintenance." Funny? Maybe. Acceptable? Absolutely not.

#### **Ghost Rounds (This One Really Boils My Blood)**

- Great rounds should be celebrated! Whether you've finally broken 20 or hit single digits—own it!
- What's not okay is following up a great round with a couple of suspiciously average ones—or worse, posting rounds you didn't even play—just to inflate your index.
   Most of you are probably thinking, "What the #\$%@ is he talking about?" Good! But unfortunately, some members are doing exactly this. And as long as I have access to GHIN, it will not stand.

#### **Final Word**

I've always said: Let the numbers do the talking. I stand by that. But while I'm not asking anyone to tattle, I do encourage you to document and report any unsportsmanlike behavior you witness.

Let's keep our handicaps honest and the game fair.

## "Anytime, Anywhere, Any Reason"

No not your wife, we are talking stroke and distance penalty...

In golf, the Rules can sometimes feel situational, with different options depending on whether your ball is in a bunker, penalty area, or lost in the rough. But there is one rule that cuts through the complexity and remains universally available: **stroke** and distance relief.

#### What Is Stroke and Distance?

Under **Rule 18.1 of the USGA Rules of Golf**, a player may always elect to take stroke and distance relief. This means returning to the spot where the previous stroke was played, adding a one-stroke penalty, and hitting again. It's simple in concept, but profound in practice: this option is always available—any time, anywhere, for any reason.

#### Why It Exists

The purpose of stroke and distance is fairness. Not every lie, condition, or circumstance can be accounted for by specific relief options. By allowing a player to return to where the last shot was struck, the Rule provides:

- Clarity Players always know they have a relief choice.
- **Equity** The penalty offsets the advantage of a "do-over" while keeping play consistent.

Strategy – Golfers can even use it tactically if replaying from the tee or fairway gives them a better chance.

#### Anytime, Anywhere, Any Reason

What makes this unique is its universality. Unlike relief for penalty areas, abnormal ground conditions, or unplayable balls—which depend on circumstances—stroke and distance is unconditional.

- Ball in a bush? You can go back.
- Awkward stance in the fairway? You can go back.

Perfectly playable lie but you simply want another chance? You can still go back.

No justification is required beyond your choice as the player.

#### A Rule Worth Remembering

When faced with trouble on the course, it's easy to feel boxed in by limited options. But the Rules of Golf are designed with flexibility in mind. Stroke and distance relief is the ultimate safety net—always available, always clear, and always fair. So next time you find yourself in a tough spot, remember: you can always take stroke and distance.

## PARTNER NET BETTER BALL WITH SCARY 38 AND 58

"I do not like them, Sam-I-Am, I do not like green eggs and ham". (Dr. Seuss).

"Ham and egg it" is a golf term for how, in a partner better ball format, one player has

a good hole if the other player has a bad hole. This is how a partner format tournament is won.

#### What is a good score for this particular format?

Low 70s is a winning score most years. Assuming you and your partner score a net par on every hole, your scores would be 57 on the 14 better ball holes and 21 on the 4 scary holes for a net 78. Net birdies are needed on several holes to win this tournament.

Congratulations to Tim Fetzer (left) and Chad Schluchter (right) on winning the Spirits Flight with a phenomenal tournament-low 69.5 (tied), beating the rest of the flight by 4.5 strokes! Over the past few years, no winning team has shot below a net 71.

Stan Kohler and Kenny Stanton won the Goblins Flight with a score of 73.5, beating Paul Hwang and Ryan West by .5 stroke.

also shot a tournament low 69.5 (tied) to win the
Ghost Flight by 3.5 strokes. Here they are
