What does it mean to be saved?

Romans 10:9

"If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

Being saved means that we believe Jesus died for our sins and rose again. When we're saved, we enter a relationship with Jesus and try to live in a way that reflects His love and teachings.

How do you get the gift of salvation?

Ephesians 2:8-9

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast."

We can't earn salvation by doing good things or achieve it on our own. Salvation is a gift from God, given to us by His grace when we put our faith in Jesus.

Who can get the gift of salvation?

John 3:16

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Anyone who believes in Jesus and turns away from sin can receive the gift of salvation. God's love is for everyone, everywhere!

How can we share the gift of salvation with others?

Matthew 28:19

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

We can share the gift of salvation by talking to people about Jesus, showing kindness, living as an example of His love, and praying for those around us. This helps others see who Jesus is through us.



What's the most special gift you've ever received, and why? What's the funniest present you've ever received? What's something you've been thankful for this week? What's one thing you love to do with your family that feels like a gift? What's something kind you've done for someone this week? How did it make them feel? If you could give a gift to the whole world, what would it be? If you could tell your friends one thing about Jesus, what would you say?
