



Forming Plurals in English

To form the plural of most nouns in English, we usually add **-s**, **-es**, or change **-y** to **-ies** depending on how the word ends.

- Add **-s** to most words: dog → dogs, car → cars
- Add **-es** to words ending in **-ch**, **-sh**, **-s**, **-x**, or **-z**: box → boxes, bus → buses
- Change **-y** to **-ies** if the word ends in a consonant + **y**: baby → babies
