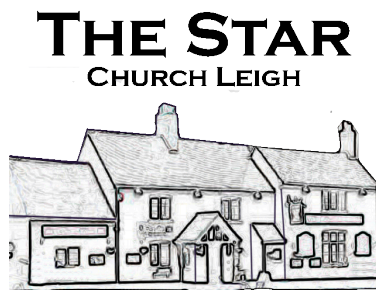

## **Leigh Produce & Craft Show Rules**

### **ENTRY FEE**

All Classes **£1**

Junior Classes **50p**

### **PRIZE CERTIFICATES AWARDED FOR 1<sup>ST</sup>, 2<sup>ND</sup> AND 3<sup>RD</sup> PLACES**

#### **Rules of the Show:**

1. All classes are open to Leigh Parish residents only.
2. All exhibits must be exhibitor's own produce/work.
3. The committee is not responsible for the loss or damage to any exhibits, but every effort will be made to safeguard them.
4. The decision of the Judges will be final.
5. All food exhibits to be covered.
6. Classes will be amalgamated where entries are small.
7. Exhibitors may enter only two exhibits in any one class.
8. All trophies are held for 1 year \*

**\* Trophies can be engraved by the winner if they wish to do so, but will be collected at the end of August of the following year, or they can be returned to a show coordinator. If you are going to be away after August please return your trophy beforehand.**

## **Show Details and Times**

### **9:30 am to 11:30-am**

The village hall will be open from 9:30am until 11:30am for all exhibits to be registered and displayed.

### **11:45am**

The doors will be closed at 11:45am PROMPT when judging will take place.

### **3:00pm**

The Village hall will open again for the general public to view the exhibits and any certificates won.

**There will be a £1 entry fee on the door for each adult (children are free of charge)**

There will be tea, coffee and cake available to purchase, kindly run by the Leigh W.I. and the local Scout and Cubs groups will be running activities/stall behind the village hall.

### **4:00pm**

Prizes will be presented.  
The raffle will be drawn.

### **Vegetable Classes**

1. Five of your finest ripe tomatoes (any variety)
  2. A selection of five potatoes (any variety)
  3. Six runner beans
  4. Four well-trimmed carrots (3" / 7.5cm tops)
  5. Three firm onions, any variety
  6. Three courgettes

### **Fruit Classes**

7. Four beautiful apples of the same variety
  8. The most unusually shaped fruit or vegetable
  9. A beautifully presented plate of any other fruit

### **Flower Classes**

10. A vase of home-grown flowers (vase height not exceeding 8" / 20cm)
  11. The most striking or unusual weed/other!
  12. A thriving indoor pot plant (pot diameter not exceeding 6" / 15cm)
  13. Four elegant roses, any variety, single rose per stem
  14. Three dazzling dahlias, any variety

### **Good Life Classes**
