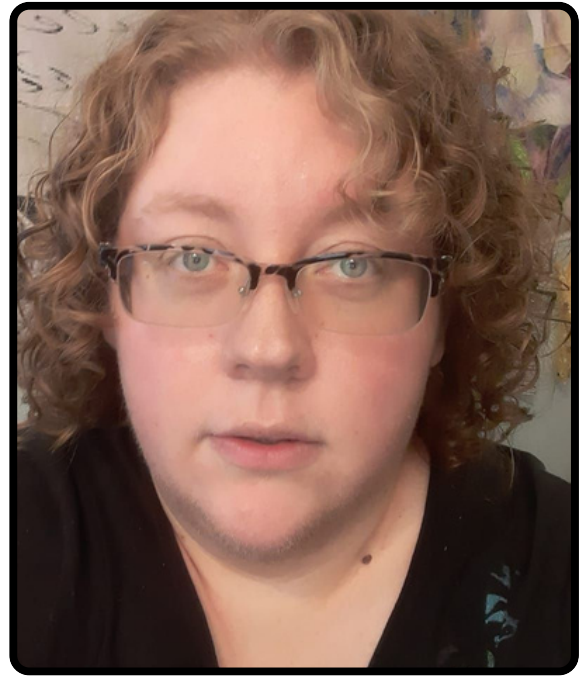

Introduction and Notes

This pattern is for personal use only. Please do not copy, resell, or redistribute this pattern. You may sell quilts using this pattern on a small independent scale. Please credit pattern to Tia Lynn Design. Please read through all of the instructions before beginning. The pattern assumes that the quilter understands basic quilting knowledge and can keep a consistent 1/4" seam allowance. All seams should be pressed to one side (the darker side), unless stated otherwise.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS: All cuts will be WOF and then broken down into smaller cuts. It is recommended to label all pieces as you cut to keep track of everything.

USEFUL TERMS: WOF = Width of fabric: the pattern assumes all fabric widths are 42" unless otherwise noted.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS: This pattern was written to minimize as much fabric waste as possible. If you pre-wash, starch, or prefer extra wiggle room, consider ordering extra fabric.

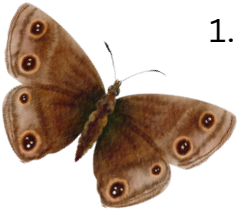
BACKING NOTES: The backing requirements include 4" extra on all sides, as this is the average requirement for long-arm quilters. These requirements do not account for directional fabrics or pattern matching - you may need to adjust the yardage as necessary.



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Cutting Instructions



1. First, you need to cut border strips from your background fabric:

a. Cut [6] 2.5" x WOF strips from Fabric A. Set aside [4] of them.

i. Subcut [1] into [2] pieces 19"x2.5" *

ii. subcut [1] into [2] pieces 7"x2.5" *

b. Set aside all border pieces until the end.

* You will have extra from these 2 strips. Save it. You might need it for step 2.

2. Cut all the rest of your fabric into 2" strips, then subcut into 2" squares. See the chart below for the number of 2" squares you will need.

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Assembly Instructions

Now that you've got all your squares cut, we'll start sewing. To make this a bit easier to digest, I've split up the design into smaller sections of 25 squares. Colored graphs are below to help you know which colors go where for each section. *(The very last column of blocks will be 5x4, so there will just be 20 squares per block.)*

Assembly is the same for each one.

1. Gather the 25 squares you need for the block.
2. Arrange as shown in the colored graph.
3. Sew each row together.
 - a. On rows 1, 3, and 5, press seams left. On rows 2 and 4, press seams to the right.
 - b. This will help the seams nest when joining. (If you prefer open seams, go ahead and do that.)
4. Sew the rows together to form a 25-patch block. Nest the seams and pin, if necessary, to line up the seams.
5. Press each block and trim to 8" if you need to.
6. Label it, so you remember where it goes in the quilt. (Alternatively, you can begin sewing the rows together as you create them so you don't get them mixed up-- go ahead, ask me how I know!)

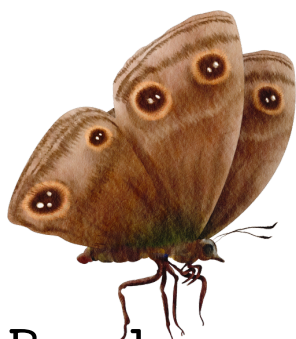

Final Layout

Use this grid for placement of the finished blocks. When sewing your blocks together, do so in rows, pinning near each intersection to line up the seams.



Border

After all your blocks are together, find your reserved Fabric A strips to make the border. Each long piece will be sewn to a shorter piece to create [2] strips 60" long and [2] strips 48" long. Sew the 60" strips onto each side, and the 48" strips to the top and bottom.

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Backing & Finishing

- Sew backing fabric using a 1/2" seam allowance.
- Make quilt sandwich by basting quilt to the batting and backing.
- Use desired basting method.
- Quilt as desired.
- Trim and square up quilt.
- Bind using 2 1/2" strips.
- Take pictures of your work of art, and tag #TiaLynnDesign and #EchoofBone

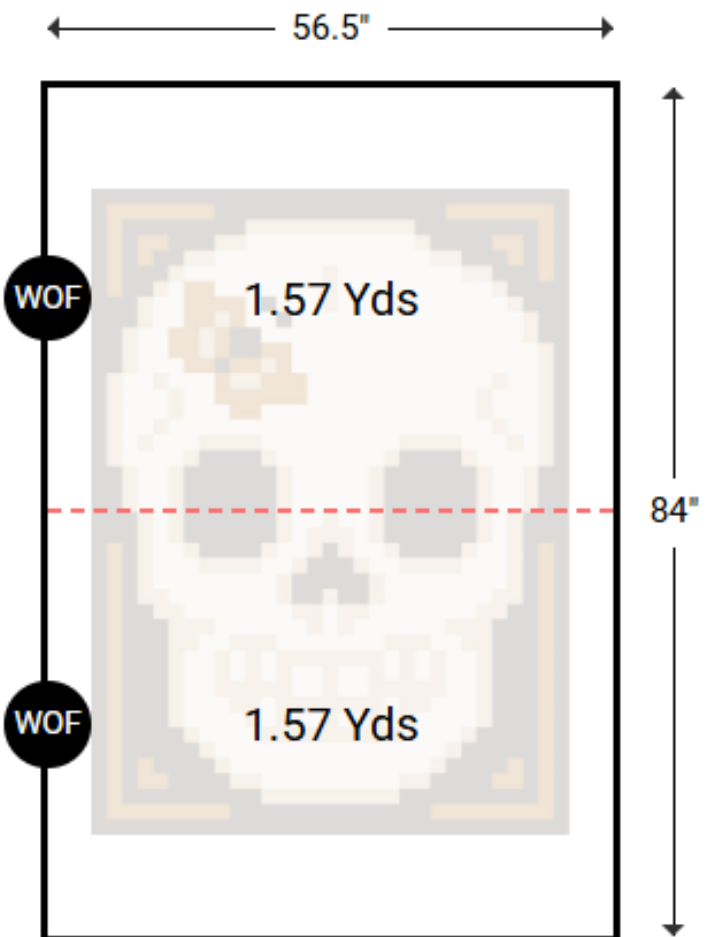

Fabric Requirements



Background: 1 ½ yard (Coffee)
Skull Color: 1 ½ yard (Off-white)
Skull Outline: 1 yard (Cream)
Border: ½ yard (Gold)

Binding: ½ Yard
Backing: 3 ⅓ yards
