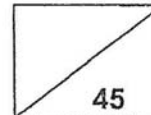

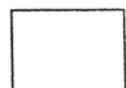

There are approximately 4000 species of frogs in the world. Recently, seven new species of miniature frogs, smaller than bumblebees, have been discovered clinging for (27) \_\_\_\_\_ survival on isolated mountaintops in Brazil.

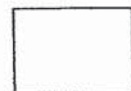
