Activity Map of Green Ark Fish Farm



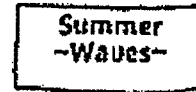

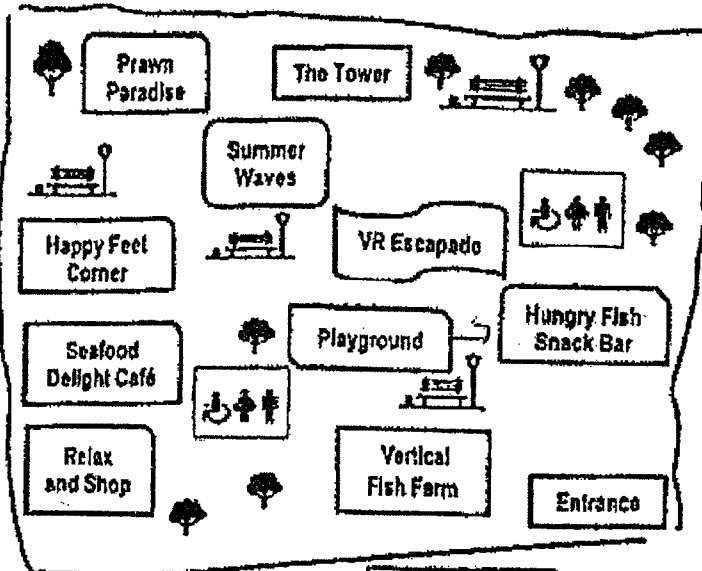

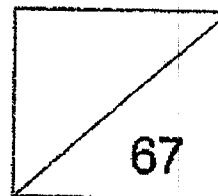
