Entry tickets are required only for the concert venues and museum.

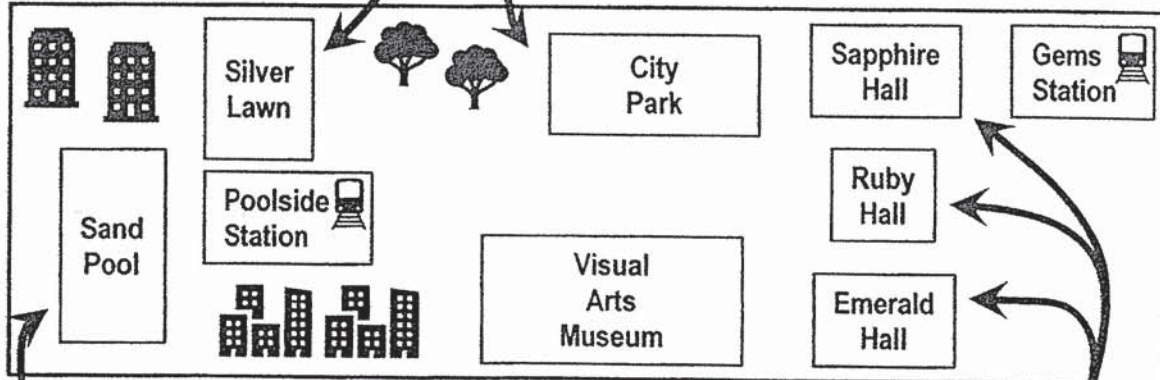
Buskers

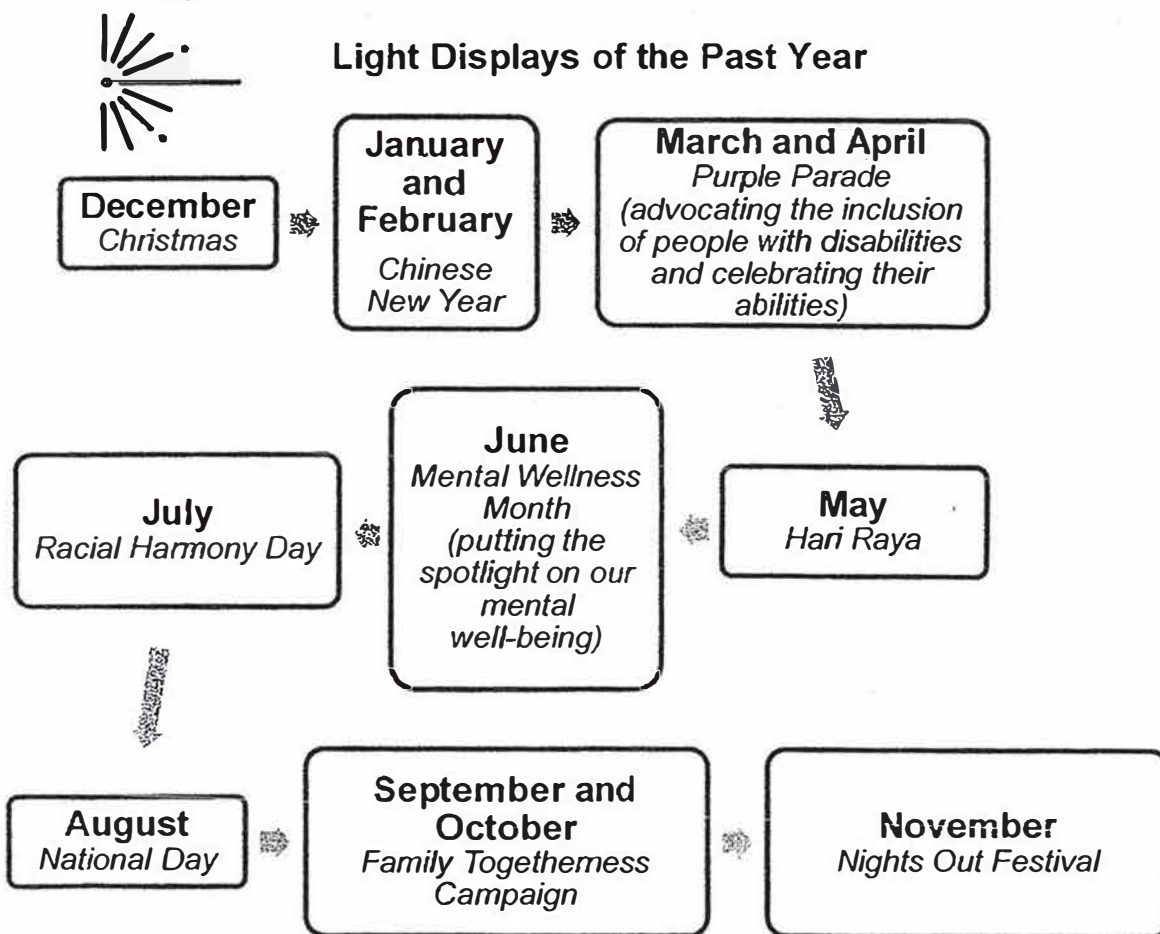

To me, Grandma's house was my second home. I had spent my entire childhood living at Grandma's and I used to visit her often even through adulthood. The door creaked open, and Grandma's blank eyes met mine. I looked deep into her eyes, hoping to see the woman who was once full of life. Now, she was a shell of her former self. Her gaze dropped to a photograph of me in her hand. She took another glance at me. Leaving the door open, she walked back into the house. I took **that** as my cue to enter.

I showed her many videos of us that I had in my mobile phone. I tried all I could.

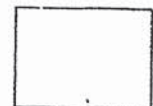

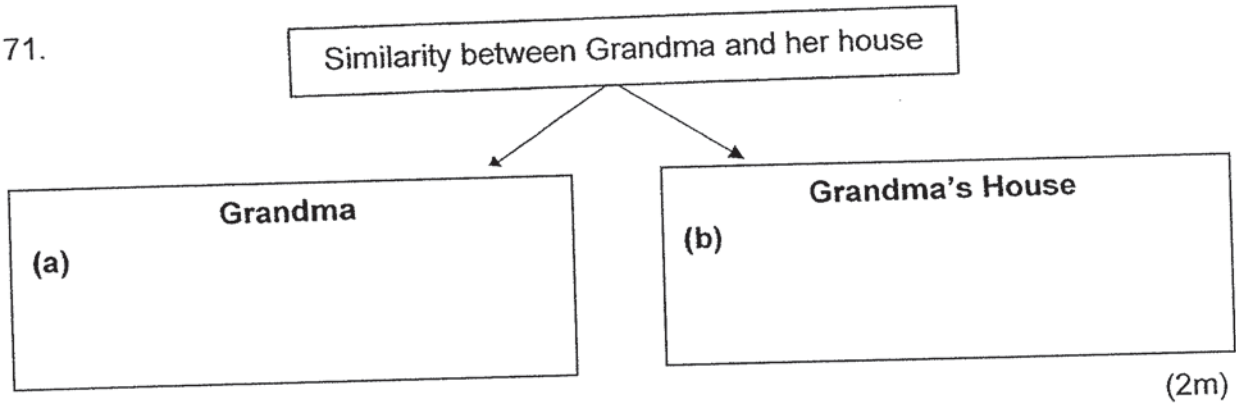

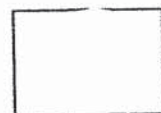
