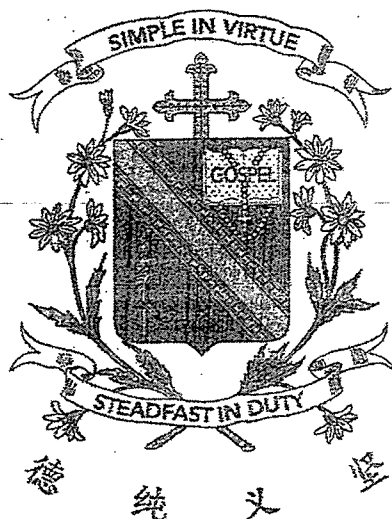

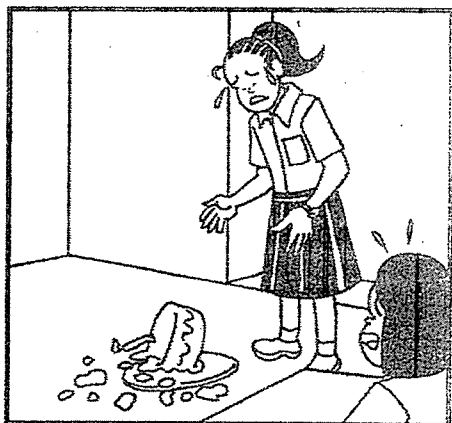
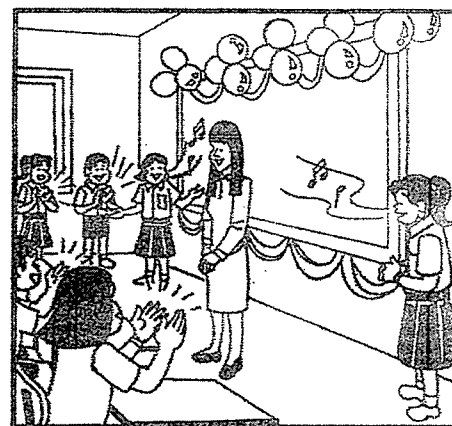
Write a story of **at least 120 words** about a prank.
