Grown from spores that float in the water, seaweeds belong to a large group of water plants called algae ---- plants without true leaves, ferns, roots or flowers. But it does contain a green pigment called chlorophyll. Chlorophyll allows plants to make its own food and give plants its green colour. The reason some seaweeds do not look green is that other pigments often conceal the chlorophyll. As a result, some seaweeds look brown or red.

The most common seaweed has bubble-like floats that children enjoy cracking open between their fingers. These plants are attached to rocks by means of root-like holdfasts. The holdfasts have to withstand the force of the waves that threatens to pull the seaweed away.

Another well-known seaweed is kelp. It fastens itself to rocks by means of leathery stalks. The kelp is often used as fertilizer because it has a high concentration of potash. When it is burnt, iodine is extracted from its ashes. In Japan, tons of seaweed are dried and used as food! For example, another seaweed called the Irish moss produces a great deal of "agar agar", a colourless jelly that is edible.

Seaweed is also a source of food and air for ocean life. Smaller sea creatures feed on it, and they in turn become food for the larger ones. Seaweed gives off oxygen, and this helps keep the water pure. Seaweed can live only at the bottom of the shallow water where sunlight is able to penetrate as it requires sunlight to make food.
