





I grew up in a small and peaceful village. Life was simple yet challenging. My parents worked tirelessly; their backs bent under the scorching sun as they ploughed the yellow dry soil laboriously – all just to earn enough to support the family.

Growing up, I did **not dare to ask for anything more than the necessities** for I knew the financial struggles of my family. One day, as I was walking along the streets, I saw a silk handkerchief on sale – one that all the girls around me seemed to have. As a young girl, I yearned to be a part of the popular group of girls in the village. Led astray by temptation, I made a **regrettable decision**. Upon returning home, I took some money from Father's drawer and bought **it**.

When Father discovered that his money had gone missing, he demanded to know who had stolen the money, holding a cane in his hand. Fear gripped me and I was speechless. He questioned my brother and me but neither of us spoke. Met with silence, he roared, "Fine! Both of you will be punished then!" Suddenly, my brother gripped my father's hand. "Pa, I did it." He shouldered the blame and **the punishment** in my place.






