

Cheetahs are the world's fastest land mammals. These mammals were widespread across African and Asian continents, but today they are confined mostly to the open grasslands of Africa.

Cheetahs are known for (11) _____ spotted fur. They have about 2,000 to 3,000 spots on their bodies, which help them to camouflage themselves. The spots are both small and large and the pattern of spots (12) _____ unique to each cheetah. The spots help them to (13) _____ in with their surroundings so that they can stalk and hunt their prey more effectively.

Cheetahs are not strong predators but they are fast. They rely on their (14) _____ - up to 113 kilometres per hour - to catch their prey. Cheetahs have slender bodies, powerful legs and flexible spines. These characteristics allow cheetahs to stretch their bodies and take rapid strides.

Running this fast (15) _____ up a lot of energy. A cheetah can only sprint for a few minutes before burning out. 
