Read this passage below and answer questions 21 to 25.

Beneath the ocean's surface waits a different world—quiet, full of wonder, shimmering with life. Carter Viss loved that world. He spent much of his free time snorkelling.

That particular Thursday morning— November 28, 2019—was especially pleasant. The water was flat, the sky blue and the underwater visibility spectacular. Carter and his friend, Andy Earl, spent a couple of hours among the sharks, eels, turtles, octopus, lionfish and angelfish. Finally, around noon, they headed for shore.

To a diver underwater, outboard engines have a clear, unmistakable sound. On the surface, however, swimming freestyle, Carter failed to hear the powerboat until it was almost on top of him. When he saw it, he knew he had just an instant. He pulled desperately to one side, getting his head and upper torso out of the boat's path before it ran him over. Screaming for his life, he slipped beneath the surface.

Andy heard his friend's **mortal terror**. He yelled at the boat to slow down. He reached Carter with urgency.

Meanwhile, the powerboat, was being reversed urgently before coming to a halt. The man at the wheel was Daniel. Horrified, he instinctively helped Andy load Carter onto the dive platform of the boat.

Despite the severity of his injuries, Carter managed to stay alive until he reached the hospital. A team of surgeons embarked on a series of operations to save Carter's life. They amputated his right arm and addressed extensive injuries to his legs. Following **these**, Carter spent 68 days in the hospital. The journey to recovery was arduous for Carter but his physical healing, including the use of fixators and a prosthetic arm, progressed remarkably well under the outstanding guidance and attention of medical professionals.

An investigation found that the powerboat had been going at least 80 kilometres per hour when it struck Carter. Daniel was charged with wilful and reckless operation of a vessel, a first-degree misdemeanour punishable by up to a year in jail. Carter insisted he did not want Daniel to be punished. He said, 'I'd rather have him working with me on ocean safety than sitting in a jail cell."

The court hearing marked the first time Carter and Daniel had seen each other since the day both their lives changed. Daniel was sentenced to 75 hours of community service, a year's probation, a \$1,000 fine and a mandate to work with Carter to enhance ocean safety and conservation. Afterward, Carter went to Daniel and shook his hand. Tears flowed and the wall of silence came down. As the two men embraced, Carter said quietly, "Let's make a difference."

When asked if the court sentence led to forgiveness, Carter replied, "Forgiveness comes from the heart. If I were him and had to live with the guilt and remorse, I'd almost prefer to be in my shoes. If I can ease someone else's pain, I will."
