Director Notes

Happy April!

We have a busy month ahead of us in the WHS Band Department including two concerts, Large Group Contest, a trip to Orlando, and at the end of month, Mrs. Coyne is due to have her new baby. Also, if your student is planning to participate in marching band this summer, commitment forms are due <u>April 1</u> and percussion auditions are due (recorded) by <u>April 8</u>.

Concerts in April include the **Showcase Concert** featuring the Symphonic Band, Symphony Orchestra, and Concert Choir on <u>Tuesday, April 19 at WHS at 7:00PM</u>. If your student is not in either of these three groups, they do not perform in this concert. Symphonic Band is featuring music from Symphony No. 1 'The Lord of the Rings' by Johan de Meij. We are excited to share this beautiful symphony with you!

We also have our **Spring Jazz Concert** on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>April 21 at WHS at 7:00PM</u>. This will feature both Jazz 2 and Jazz 1 for the final performance of the school year.

Between these two concerts, students in **Concert Band and Symphonic Band** will participate in our Region Large Group Contest at Brandon Valley High School on Wednesday, April 20 during the school day. Both bands will take our contest set and play them in front of a panel of judges who will then rate us on a 5-point scale where 1 is the highest and 5 is the lowest. These performances are open to public audiences if you would like to watch either band perform.

- Concert Band performs at 10:40AM in the Brandon Valley High School Auditorium
- Symphonic Band performs at 11:20AM in the Brandon Valley High School Auditorium

After our performance, the students will have lunch at the Brandon Valley Pizza Ranch before heading back to their 6-7 period classes so they will need lunch money for this event.

Lastly, as you are looking ahead to May, we have one final **Spring Band Concert** on Monday, May 16. This is also our band senior recognition night. Even though Mrs. Coyne will be gone on maternity leave in the month of May, we have a student teacher and a great, former band director coming in to substitute. This concert will feature the Freshman/Varsity Band, the Concert Band, The Orlando Band, and a combined piece with the Concert and Symphonic Band. Before the combined piece, each 2022 senior **and their parents** will be recognized and asked to come on stage as we announce their plans for next year. We hope to see many parents in attendance on this night to help us celebrate the class of 2022.

Please check out the UPDATED marching band calendar at the end of this newsletter as we near the end of the year and move into our summer marching season. As a final reminder, remember that if your student is in Symphonic Band for 2022-2023 school year they are required to play at THIS YEAR'S graduation. Please make plans to have your next year's Symphonic Band students at the convention center for graduation on Sunday, May 29 at 1:00PM.

Fundraising Opportunities

There are many opportunities throughout the year (including during the summer months) to raise funds for the band and for your individual student's fundraising account. Here are the upcoming and ongoing fundraisers:

BUTTERBRAID & PUFFINS – Fundraiser started on March 30th. Orders are due April 20th. Delivery will be Tuesday, May 3rd in the band room. **ALL ITEMS MUST BE PICKED UP ON THIS DAY**.

HY-VEE CARDS – Earn funds when buying your groceries! That's right – you can earn fundraising money just by purchasing Hy-Vee cards to fund your regular grocery store shopping. The form and more information are at the end of this newsletter and available on our website at <u>washingtonbands.org/hy-vee</u>. Hy-Vee cards are also sold at Band Booster meetings, band concerts and other events.

INTERSTATE BATTERIES – We have packs of 24 – AA & AAA batteries available. The packs sell for \$15 each and the students receive a profit of \$9-\$10 on 1) each pack sold. The battery form is available online and batteries are sold at Band Booster meetings, Band concerts and other events.

SCRIP CARDS – WHS Band Boosters orders gift cards at a discount. Families pay face value for the cards and the difference is an instant rebate for your student's fundraising account. There are number of volunteer opportunities with the band each year – helping with marching band, chaperoning at competitions and games, selling tickets at concerts, organizing band events, etc. There are a variety of ways to help that meet your schedule – from very small to larger time commitments.

COMMITTEE LEADERS:

- Indoor Show Dinner & Raffle/Auction this is the culmination of our marching band season and is held during the Indoor Marching Band Show. Ideally this event is would have coleaders. Committee leaders organize the dinner and ensure there are volunteers to work the event. The raffle & auction consists of organizing and securing donations (with the help of volunteers) to use as raffle items and create auction packages. The process of securing donations starts in early summer.
- Fundraising work with directors on ideas for monthly fundraisers, sign up for Weisser Distributing dates, create the volunteer sign-ups for them if needed. Many fundraisers we repeat every year but the fundraiser committee leader will research and secure other possible fundraising opportunities.
- Newsletter Editor create/design newsletter each month for band director to email to band families. There is a template to follow and many band parents and the directors contribute to content. Current editor will train new editor.
