Police Offer Online Reporting Option

Have you ever felt you should report something to police, but weren't sure you should call 911? The OKC Police Department has launched a system that allows you to report certain incidents online, via email.

The online method is not appropriate for situations where an emergency exists, a crime is in progress, forensic evidence must be collected, or theft of a firearm or vehicle is involved. However, it's an alternative for those who need to report something like minor theft, fraud, forgery, vandalism, and certain other types of incidents.

All reports filed online are assigned a tracking number for processing. Each is reviewed by the OKCPD Records Unit, and the resident filing the report receives an email notification as to whether the report needs follow-up information, is rejected, or is approved.



Once approved, emailed reports can be given an incident number and investigated further.

To use the online reporting system, go to www.okc.gov, and click on the "Departments" link, then the "Police" link. You will then see a further link entitled "Report a Crime." The

site includes a how-to video to help you learn more about the online reporting method. The Police Department emphasizes that if you are unsure whether the incident you wish to report is eligible for online reporting, don't hesitate to use the traditional "Call 911" method.

Members Vote at Annual Meeting

♦ **Memorial Day Affects Trash Pickup.** Monday, May 26 is the day we observe Memorial Day. Our regular household trash collection will not occur on the holiday, but will be delayed until makeup day, Wednesday, May 28.

♦ **Free Landfill Day Coming Soon.** If you missed the last bulky waste collection, or you just have too much junk to put out on the curb, you can dispose of it free of charge on Saturday, May 17. The city has set that date as Free Landfill Day. Landfills will be open from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Each household can make one trip using a passenger vehicle or truck up to one ton, and add a trailer up to 16 feet in length. (Note that appliances, electronics, and hazardous waste are not accepted at the landfill.) The nearest landfill to our neighborhood is at 7600 S.W. 15th Street. Bring a current city water bill as proof you are an OKC resident.
