The recent heavy rainfall and flooding have devastated numerous colonies and slums, including Sing Nagar, Krishna Lank, Ramakrishna Puram, and Raja Rajeswari Peta, as well as YSR colony (Milk Factory Centre), affecting around 350,000 individuals. Recognizing the unfortunate plight of the flood-affected population, AKMES has undertaken the task of distributing cooked food packets of lemon rice, together with water bottles.

Overview:

In response to the devastating floods that have recently affected Vijayawada and surrounding areas in the NTR District of Andhra Pradesh, a comprehensive food assistance initiative was launched as part of the flood relief efforts supported by the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) program of ONGC, Rajahmundry, East Godavari District, AP. This initiative aims to provide immediate relief to the communities that have been severely impacted by the unprecedented rainfall and flooding.

Impact of the Flooding:

The torrential rains have led to significant flooding in various neighborhoods and slums, including Sing Nagar, Krishna Lank, Ramakrishna Puram, Raja Rajeswari Peta, and YSR Colony (Milk Factory Centre). Approximately 350,000 individuals have been affected, facing challenges such as loss of shelter, disruption of daily life, and limited access to essential resources.
