1. Space, Structure, Setup

- Budget Setups (8 page Google Doc with links & resources): Space affects the structure, affects the setup, affects the planning
 - Space/Living situation
 - o Structure
 - Planning the set up
 - Foam, Curtains, Blankets
 - Shelves
 - Lights
 - Equipment
 - Microphones
 - Mic Stands
 - Interfaces & Pre-Amps
 - Software
 - Extras (helpful add-ons)
 - Resources

2. How to treat your Mic / aka: Mic technique

- Hand distance from you to mic
 - If you're in a studio <u>DO NOT TOUCH THE MIC</u>. Let the audio engineer handle it
- Pop screen (mine was discounted with tare, used pantyhose & twist tie to fix)
 - Divert a Plosive "p" by using finger or pencil/pen to divert the air
- Familiar with the "Gain" of you mic setup for loud or soft moments
 - Unless you're in a studio, and then you DO NOT TOUCH THE MIC
- Stay "on mic"
 - Plant your feet and mouth, everything else moves!
- Beware of clothing/jewelry or other things that a mic can pick up
- CABLE MANAGEMENT (get organized)

3. Energy, Acting, Imagination

- Acting is #1, voice/character follows (adding Layers to a character voice)
 - ACTING is the foundation on which the character's "voice" stands
- Improv is your friend to imagination (play with your inner child)
 - <u>Classes</u> (specifically improv or/also acting classes)
 - Improv, Misner, Cold Reading, Script Breakdown

- Misner: school of acting from Stanford Misner that emphasizes being "in the moment" and behaving truthfully under imaginary circumstances (lends itself to voice acting that's typically isolated in a booth with no props, costumes, no sets, ect.)
- Camera vs VO classes
 - Camera: Expressive in your voice but toned down physically
 - VO: Purely voice expression. Over-expressive in the face and body is good!
- o Jobs/volunteer work that will train you/give you experience
 - Ex: GA Ren Fair Improv, Live performance, Character breakdowns, accents, Shakespearean language, Music/Singing
 - Student Films/ check out local Colleges
 - Performance venues
 - Community theater!
 - TTRPG / LARP / aka: Roleplaying in character
 - Musicians/Singers
- MOVE! BE A MUPPET (But stay "on mic")
 - Plant your feet and mouth, everything else moves!

4. 7 Physical Character Placements in the body

- How to find "Layers" to add to your acting
 - Top: top of the head
 - o Eyes: Bright sound, "Disney channel" voice
 - Adenoidal: "Surfer Dude"
 - o Nasal: Nerdy
 - Throat: Pirate
 - o Chest: Hero
 - Diaphragm: Villian
- "Typlical" Stereotypes, but a Top voice can also be a villain! Play!

Extra placements

- o Bubble: the "Stich" voice
- False folds: Metal/screaming and creatures
- If it ever hurts, STOP!
- Find where the voice sits comfortably for you, it's YOUR body!

5. How T and E can affect the voice

- 1st puberty: Estrogen = small voice box, thin vocal folds
 - 2nd: Testosterone = small voice box, thicker folds
 - Masculinization: open and broadening the voice

- 1st puberty: Testosterone = large voice box, thick vocal folds
 - 2nd: Estrogen = large voice box, still thick vocal folds
 - Typically train the falsetto or higher in the vocal placements
 - See Resource: Zheanna Erose
 - Speaking in a forward placement, narrowing
- Pitch does not equal gender, it ALSO needs Resonance
 - Pitch is the "High & Low" sound
 - Resonance or "Weight," or formant (dark vs bright), is JUST as important
 - Size of the voice box affects the resonance | folds effect the pitch
 - Requires a new placement, new manipulation of the larynx/resonance chamber/voice box
